# 1. THE UNIVERSITY

## 1.1 Introduction

The Indira Gandhi National Open University was established by an Act of Parliament in 1985 to achieve the following objectives:

- democratising higher education by taking it to the doorsteps of the learners,
- providing access to high quality education to all those who seek it irrespective of age, region, religion and gender,
- offering need-based academic programmes by giving professional and vocational orientation to the courses, and
- promoting and developing distance education in India.

## 1.2 Prominent Features

IGNOU has certain unique features such as:

- national jurisdiction with international presence
- flexible admission rules
- individualised study: flexibility in terms of place, pace and duration of study
- use of latest information and communication technologies
- nationwide student support services network
- cost-effective programmes
- modular approach to programmes
- resource sharing, collaboration and networking with conventional universities, open universities and other institutions/organisations
- socially and academically relevant programmes based on students' need analysis, and
- convergence of open and conventional education systems

- Recognition as Centre of Excellence in Distance Education by the Commonwealth of Learning (1993).

## 1.4 The Schools of Studies

With a view to develop interdisciplinary programmes, the University operates through its Schools of Studies. ## 1.5 Academic Programmes

The University offers Certificates, Diplomas, Advance Diplomas, Post Graduate Diplomas and Degrees, which are conventional as well as innovative. Most of these programmes have been developed after an initial survey of the need for such programmes. They are launched with a view to fulfilling the learners' needs for:

- certification,
- improvement of skills,
- acquisition of professional qualifications,
- continuing education and professional development at workplace,
- self-enrichment,
- diversification and updating of knowledge, and
- empowerment.

## 1.6 Course Preparation

Learning material is specially prepared by teams of experts drawn from different universities and specialized institutions in the area spread throughout the country as well as in-house faculty. The material is scrutinized by the content experts, in-house faculty and edited by the language experts at IGNOU before these are finally sent for printing. Similarly, audio and video materials are produced in consultation with the course writers, in-house faculty and producers. The material is previewed and reviewed by the faculty as well as outside experts and edited/modified, wherever necessary, before they are finally dispatched to the students, Study Centres and Telecast through Gyan Darshan.

## 1.7 Credit System

### a) Defining Credit in ODL

The University follows the 'Credit System' for most of its programmes. Each credit in our system is equivalent to 30 hours of learner study comprising all learning activities (i.e. reading and comprehending

the print material, listening to audio, watching video, attending counselling sessions, teleconference and writing assignment responses). Thus, a 4-credit course involves 120 hours of study and a 6-credit course involves 180 hours of study. This helps the learner to know the academic effort he/she has to put in, to successfully complete a course. Completion of an academic programme (Degree or Diploma) requires successful completion of the assignments, practical, projects and the Term-End Examination as per requirement of each course in a programme.

### **b) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)**

The Bachelor's Degree Programmes offered through this prospectus follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by UGC. The CBCS provides the learner with flexibility to study the subjects/courses at their own pace; greater choice of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses; and mobility to different institutions for studies. The system has the following advantages:

- Allows learners to choose a combination of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented courses (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude).
- Makes education broad-based and at par with global standards.
- Offers flexibility for learners to study at different times and at different institutions to complete the programme. Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to another institution.

## **1.8 Support Services**

In order to provide individualized support to its learners, the University has a large number of Study Centres, spread across the country. These Study Centres are coordinated by 67 Regional Centres and Recognised Regional Centres. At the Study Centres, the learners interact with the Academic Counselors and other learners, refer to books in the Library, watch/listen to video/audio programmes and interact with the Coordinator on administrative and academic matters. The list of Regional Centres is given in this Prospectus. Support services are also provided through Work Centres, Programme Study Centres, Skill Development Centres and Special Study Centres.

## **1.9 Programme Delivery**

The methodology of instruction in this University is different from that of the conventional Universities. The Open University system is more learner-oriented and the learner is an active participant in the pedagogical (teaching and learning) process. Most of the instructions are imparted through distance education methodology as per the requirement.

The University follows a multimedia approach for instruction, which comprises:

- a) Self Instructional Written Material:** The printed study material (written in self-instructional style) for both theory and practical components of the programmes is provided to the learners in the form of a single print book and/or e-book, comprising blocks and units or in the form of separate printed blocks for every course (on an average 1 block per credit). A block which comes in the form of a booklet usually comprises 3 to 5 units.

**Audio-Visual Material Aids:** The learning package contains audio and video programmes which have been produced by the University for better clarification and enhancement of understanding of the course material given to the learners. A video programme is normally of 25-30 minutes duration.

- b)** The Video content is available on eGyan kosh ([www.egyankosh.ac.in](http://www.egyankosh.ac.in)) – the digital learning repository of the University.

**The video programmes are also telecast on National Network of Doordarshan and Gyan Darshan. All Gyan Vani** stations broadcast curriculum based audio programmes as per their schedule that is notified in advance. In addition, some selected stations of All India Radio also broadcast the audio programmes. Learners can confirm the dates for the programmes from their study centres. The information is also provided through the university website.

- c) Counselling Sessions:** Normally counselling sessions are held as per schedule drawn by the Study Centres. These are mostly held outside the regular working hours of the host institutions where the study centres are located.

- d) Teleconferences:** Live teleconferencing sessions are conducted via satellite through interactive Gyan Darshan Channel as well as simultaneously [webcaste at www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)

- e) Practicals/ Project Work: Some Programmes have practical/project component also depending upon the learning requirements. Practical sessions are held at designated institutions for which schedule is provided by the Study Centres. Attendance at practical sessions is compulsory. For project work, comprehensive project guide, in the form of a booklet, is provided to the learner along with the study material.

### 1.10 Evaluation System

The system of evaluation followed by the University also is different from that of conventional universities. IGNOU has a multitier system of evaluation.

1. Self-assessment exercises within each unit of study material.
2. Continuous evaluation mainly through assignments which are tutor-marked, practical assignments and seminar/ workshops/extended contact programmes, etc.
3. Term-End Examinations (TEE).
4. Project / Term-end Practical examination.

The evaluation of learners depends upon various instructional activities undertaken by them. A learner has to write assignment responses compulsorily before taking Term-End Examinations from time to time to complete an academic programme. A learner has to submit Tutor Marked Assignments (TMA) responses to the Coordinator of the Study Centre to which s/he is attached. **Term-end examination is conducted at various examination centres spread all over the country and abroad in June and December every year.**

IGNOU uses the following system of "Grading" for evaluating learners' achievement

For Bachelors' and Masters' degree programmes, normally the system of numerical marking is followed, and the marks secured in assignments, TE Exams, etc. are later converted into grades as per the five-point grading scale given above. However, if required by the learner, the university provides numerical marks and division (I, II or Pass).

IGNOU uses 10-Point Grading System for evaluating learners' achievement for Bachelor Degree Programmes under CBCS, as under:

## Term-End Examination and Payment of Examination Fee

The University conducts Term-end Examination (TEE) twice a year in the months of June & December. A learner is permitted to appear in TEE subject to the following conditions:-

1. Registration for the courses is valid and not time barred.
2. Required number of assignments in the courses have been submitted by due date wherever applicable.
3. Minimum time to pursue these courses as per the provision of the programme has been completed.
4. Examination fee for all the courses the learner is appearing in the examination has been paid.

In the case of non-compliance of any of the above conditions, the result of all such courses is liable to be withheld by the University.

### Term-end Examination

The learners are required to fill in the Examination form to appear in the TEE each time i.e. for every exam (June/ December) a learner has to apply afresh. The Examination Forms are accepted online only as per the schedule given below.

Examination fee once paid is neither refundable nor adjustable even if the learner fails to appear in the examination.

#### Hall Ticket for Term End Examination

No hall ticket shall be dispatched to the examinees. Hall Tickets of all examinees are uploaded on the University Website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)) 7-10 days before the commencement of the Term End Examinations. Therefore, learners are advised to visit IGNOU website for updates.

Students are advised to take the print out of the Hall Ticket from University website after entering the enrolment number and name of programme of study, and report at the examination centre along with the Identity Card issued by the University. Without a valid IGNOU Student ID Card issued by the University, examinees will not be permitted to appear in the examination.

In case, any learner has misplaced the Identify Card issued by the University, it is mandatory to apply for a duplicate Identity Card to the Regional Centre concerned well before commencement of the examinations so as to get a duplicate ID Card in time, since the learners without valid ID Card will not be allowed to enter the Examination Centre premises.

### 1.11 Associate Studentship

The University has a scheme of 'Associate Studentship' which provides for a candidate who fulfils the minimum eligibility requirements for the programme under which the course(s) is/are offered, to register for only one course

or a limited number of courses, subject to a minimum of 8 credits and maximum of 32 credits. An Associate Student is attached to a Study Centre for counselling, assignment evaluation, library facility, etc. The application form provided at the end of the Prospectus at **Annexure VIII** can be used for registration. A fee of **Rs.850/- for BTS Programme and Rs.1150/- per 8 credit course, or part thereof**, is charged for admission to course(s) under BSW programme. The **fee is irrespective of whether the course is of 2 credits, 4 credits, 6 credits or 8 credits**. For rest of the programmes, the fee will be charged on **pro-rata basis**, i.e. by dividing the programme fee by the number of credits of the programme = **fee for 1 credit, multiplied by the credit assigned to the specific course (rounded off to the next Fifty Rs.)**. **The Scheme of Associate Studentship will NOT be available in case of CBCS based Bachelor Degree Programmes.**

The minimum and maximum period allowed to Associate students for completion of their course(s) would be **six months and two years**, respectively. There will be no separate counselling or lab work schedule for the associate students. They will have to be in touch with the Study Centre concerned in order to know the schedule and participate in the sessions accordingly. **Minimum period of six months would be allowed, if the courses opted by the students are up to 16 credits. If the option exceeds 16 credits, the minimum period would be one year.**

Associate Students would be permitted to seek admission in any of the admission cycles and to opt the courses that are on offer either in January or July cycles. However, no counselling and/or lab/practicals would be conducted separately for the Associate students. The facility of theory/practical counselling shall be provided of the allotted study centre along with other students registered for the same course(s).

If an Associate student opts for more than 16 credits worth of courses in either of the admission cycles, he/she is **not entitled to seek admission in the next consecutive cycle** unless the prescribed minimum duration is completed.

Associate Students are not eligible to seek admission to the courses under the Programmes where the number of seats are limited and/or the admission is done through Entrance Test .

Associate Students are **not eligible for the award of any kind of 'Certificate/Diploma/Degree'**. They are also not eligible for continuation of study by way of re-registration for 2<sup>nd</sup> and/or 3<sup>rd</sup> year, as the case may be. **'COURSE COMPLETION STATUS' Card** only will be issued to Associate Students.

**Change of course is not permitted under this scheme.** Similarly, re-admission facility is not extended to Associate Students. Separate Enrolment No., i.e. **'AS - - - - -'** would be allotted to such students. **The filled-in forms of 'Associate Studentship' are to be sent to the Regional Director concerned.** Forms received by any Office other than the Regional Centre concerned would be summarily rejected.

## 1.12 International Students Residing in India

The foreign nationals are advised to visit INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS section of the IGNOU website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)) for the programmes on offer for them; programme fee and other fees applicable for them. They may also contact International Division of the University at the headquarters for more details.

## 1.13 Provisional Admission

The University has a provision for Provisional Admission to the programmes offered through Common Prospectus (except Certificate programmes of six month duration, Awareness programmes, non-credit programmes and Merit-based/Entrance Test based programmes). Those candidates who otherwise fulfill the prescribed eligibility criteria, but are unable to apply for want of declaration of result of the qualifying examination and/or for want of final Mark-Sheet and Provisional Certificate, but are desirous of seeking admission in July/January admission cycle, as the case may be, can submit the prescribed admission form with requisite fee, as per schedule. Such candidates are also required to submit the **'Undertaking'** given in **Annexure II**.

Other terms and conditions for seeking Provisional Admission are :

- i) All the prospective students who have submitted their filled-in admission form along with the Undertaking are required to submit the consolidated Final Mark-sheet and Provisional Certificate/Degree Certificate by **30<sup>th</sup> September** (for July admission cycle) and **31<sup>st</sup> March** (for January admission cycle).
- ii) Failure to submit the Final Mark-sheet and Provisional Certificate/Degree Certificate will attract cancellation of admission and **forfeiture of 25% of fee paid**.
- iii) Self-learning material will be issued to all the candidates seeking 'Provisional Admission' on remittance of the programme fee, as in the case of other students.
- iv) Regional Directors will confirm the final admission only on fulfillment of the condition at (i) above.
- v) Admission will not be offered in a Programme if the programme is not activated in a particular Regional Centre.

**Note: Provisional admission is not applicable for international students.**

### 1.14 Online Admission System

The Admission Forms can be submitted online (except for International Students) through Online Admission System at <http://onlineadmission.ignou.ac.in>. Currently, the facility is available for the programmes offered through Common Prospectus except merit-based and entrance test based programmes. The prospective learners are required to create their user ID and password for logging in the system and upload the required documents along with the submission of the Admission Form. There is no need to send the printed copy of the Admission Form to the Regional Centre. The programme fee can be paid online using payment Gateway through net banking, debit card and credit card. Once the admission form is submitted online, the students can track the progress of their admission. A message is sent on the mobile number and email ID registered with the System once admission is confirmed. In case of any discrepancy in the Admission Form, the prospective students are advised to remove the discrepancy within a stipulated time. Failing to do so will lead to rejection of admission form.

The prospective learners submitting the Admission Form through this System can download the Prospectus free from IGNOU website <http://www.ignou.ac.in>. However, an amount of **Rs.200/- is charged** as registration fee along with the programme fee.

### 1.15 eGyan Kosh

The IGNOU eGyan Kosh (<http://www.egyankosh.ac.in>) one of the world's largest repositories of educational resources in higher education-is available for the learners and teachers, and public at large for free. The eGyan Kosh currently houses the self-learning material of over 2500 courses and an equal number of video programmes of IGNOU. The IGNOU learners are encouraged to make use of these resources for their learning.

### 1.16 Vidya Lakshmi Portal

Vidya Lakshmi Portal is a first of its kind portal for students seeking Education Loan. Set up in August 2015, it is a single window electronic platform for students to access information and prepare applications for Educational Loans and Government Scholarships. The Portal has the facility of tracking the students right from the inception of loan application until the completion of sanction of loan or otherwise. Students can view, apply and track their education loan applications to banks anytime, anywhere through the Portal. The portal has been developed and being maintained by NSDL e-Governance Infrastructure Limited.

Nearly 40 Banks have registered for over **70 Educational Loan Schemes** on the Vidya Lakshmi Portal and integrated their system with the Portal for providing loan processing status to students.

## 2. MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAMMES

### 2.1 Master of Computer Applications (MCA)

#### School of Computer & Information Sciences (SOCIS)

The broad objective of the MCA is to prepare graduate students for productive careers in software industry academia by providing an outstanding environment for teaching and research in the core and emerging areas of the discipline. The programme's thrust is on giving the students a thorough and sound background in theoretical and application-oriented courses relevant to the latest computer software development. The programme emphasizes the application of software technology to solve mathematical, computing, communications/networking and commercial problems. The Master's Degree Programme has been designed with a semester approach in mind. The first year courses are aimed at skills development in computers using various technologies, the second year is more focused on core courses providing a conceptual framework and the third year provides the specialization and the project work. After the successful completion of first year courses, the student will receive the PGDCA (Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications) certificate.

**Eligibility:** Any Bachelor's degree of minimum 3 (three) year duration from a recognized University AND

Mathematics as one of the subject at 10+2 level or graduation level; else the student is required to pursue and pass the BCS12 course concurrently with IGNOU MCA.

**Medium of Instruction:** English

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered in both January & July cycle of admissions

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 72,000/- for full programme to be paid semester wise @Rs. 12000/- per semester. Non Maths students have to pay Rs.1,400/- additional in the first semester.

#### Programme Details:

The programme has been divided into two semesters per year (January-June and July-December). Consequently, there will be two examinations every year – one in the month of June for the January to June Semester courses and the other is December for the July to December semester courses. The students are at liberty to appear any of the examinations conducted by the University during the year subject to completing the minimum time frame and other formalities prescribed for the programme.

## 2.2 Master of Science (Food Nutrition) (MSCDFSM)

### School of Continuing Education (SOCE)

The M.Sc. Programme in the area of Dietetics and Food Service Management has been developed with a view to address the needs of training work force/developing manpower (dietitians, nutrition counsellors, food service managers etc.) for the emerging employment sector (hospital/community dietetics, food service management). The programme will offer unique opportunity of higher education to learners to enrich their working lives by entering into the market and/or starting their own food service unit, leading to entrepreneurship. The programme also focuses on upgrading the professional competencies of serving personnel in food service establishments, such as dietitians, diet technicians, counsellors etc. upgrading their knowledge and equipping them with productive skills to enhance their career progression and employability.

The special feature of the programme is that it has a provision of exit point for learners in the form of Post Graduate Diploma in Dietetics and Public Nutrition (PGDDPN) after having successfully completed 30 credit course work and three months internship programme (16 credits).

**Eligibility:** <sup>a</sup>B.Sc. (Home Science) specialization in Food and Nutrition, Dietetics and Clinical Nutrition or PG Diploma in Dietetics and Public Health Nutrition or Graduate (B.Sc.) or equivalent (MBBS, BHHS etc) from the following background – Home Science/ Food Science and Technology, Life Science, Microbiology Medical, Pharmaceutical, Catering along with the DNHE or CNCC or CFN offered by IGNOU (Simultaneous admission for CFN/CNCC is also permitted).

**Medium of Instruction:** English

**Duration:** Minimum 2 years and Maximum 5 years; offered only July cycle of admission only.

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 32,400/- for full programme to be paid year wise @Rs. 16,200/- per year.

**Practical:** Practical courses constitute the backbone of the MSc. (DFSM) programme. Participation in the practical sessions is absolutely compulsory. Each practical course is worth 2 credits and the duration of the practical sessions is 7 days i.e. 14 sessions of 4 hours each. The term end practical examination will be held in the 15th session of the practical spell.

**Internship:** Duration of internship for three months in the Dietetic Department of a recognized hospital/ institution, for the award of M.Sc.(DFSM) degree is compulsory (except in case of credit transfer cases). For PGDDPN learners' internship for three months is compulsory.

University allows credit transfer in the MSc. (DFSM) Programme to in-service dietitians (with a degree in Post Graduate Diploma in Dietetics and Public Health Nutrition only) who have successfully completed a three month internship programme from a recognized institutions/ university in the last 5 years.

## 2.4 Master of Science (Counselling and Family Therapy) (MSCCFT) School of Continuing Education (SOCE)

The M.Sc. programme in the area of Counselling and Family Therapy is aimed at developing professionals in this vital field, which is gaining greater salience in the present times both from social and employment perspectives. The contemporary social scenario has resulted in an increased need and demand for professional support in terms of counselling and family therapy, which is being increasingly recognized as an effective approach both for promoting positives like strengthening family ties, fostering positive parenting, and increasing resilience of individuals in vulnerable situations as well as for addressing negative aspects such as socio-psychological problems, maladaptive behaviours, declining mental health, and psychosomatic disorders that are being increasingly witnessed in the present times. However, though the need for counselling and family therapy professionals is being increasingly felt, there is a dearth of professional support and experts who could lend a helping hand in promoting positive family processes and help individual family members in distress in a comprehensive way. As a result, there is a tremendous felt need for education and training in this area. By developing the requisite knowledge, understanding, attitudes and skills in the area of Counselling and Family Therapy, this unique programme of study would help to train professional cadres in the field, equipping them for both wage-employment and self-employment, and thus fill the existing lacuna.

A remarkable feature of this programme of study is its focus on the applied aspect and the thrust on opportunities for hands-on experience for the learner. In fact, almost half the credits of this Master's Degree Programme are ear-marked for application-oriented learning opportunities. In the second year of the programme, the learner has the option to be trained in Marital and Family Therapy and Counselling, Child and Adolescent Counselling and Family Therapy or Substance Abuse Counselling and Family Therapy. Yet another special feature of the programme is that it has a provision of exit point for learners (after successful completion of the first year courses) in the form of P.G. Diploma in Counselling and Family Therapy (PGDCFT). The programme has theory, supervised practicum, internship, and dissertation as components.

**Eligibility:** ° Bachelor's degree with specialization in subjects like Human Development and Family Studies, Child Development, Human Development and Childhood Studies, Child Development and Family Relationships, Home Science, Psychology, Social Work, Medicine or other allied disciplines. ## 2.9 Master of Social Work (Counselling) (MSWC) School of Social Work (SOSW)

Masters in Social Work (Counselling) would provide both academic learning and professional education and training in Counselling, extending beyond theoretical knowledge. There is a good potential for employment in government as well as NGO sectors. There is an urgent need for specially trained counselors to handle the stress of employees working with call centres, corporate sectors, families, family courts, correctional settings, school, universities and educational institutions, rehabilitation centres, refugee camps, institutions for the differently abled, aged, child care and adoption centres, family planning, voluntary Counselling and testing centres, rural sectors especially where farmers are driven to commit suicide, de-addiction centres etc.

MSW(C) Programme would be offered initially through one or two study centres under each Regional Centre. The programme can be taken only through activated study centres or special study centres through each Regional Centre. This Programme is being offered only in English. For Field Work in the MSW (Counselling) programme much focus is given on specialization in Counselling and 40 percent weightage is given for the practicum.

## 2.23 Master of Arts (Gender and Development Studies) (MAGD) School of Gender & Development Studies (SOGDS)

The programme is likely to be of interest to academics and researchers; trainers, facilitators, supervisors; staff of organizations working in the area of gender and development; government personnel; personnel working in banks and financial institutions.

Development policies and practices have a differential impact on women and men. This necessitates an understanding of the "gender gap" in access to resources, privileges, entitlements and choices. Consensus has evolved around the need to explore the "gender gap" in key development sectors and how this gap can be bridged. There is now greater emphasis on mainstreaming gender perspectives into the development process. This will contribute to building a gender-sensitive rubric of development, recasting development theory and action in the "direction of improved living standards, socially responsible management and use of resources, elimination of gender subordination and socioeconomic inequality as well as to promote the organizational restructuring required to bring about desirable change."

Exploration of gender issues has become an important activity for most non-governmental organizations. Increasing emphasis is being laid in Governmental agencies on establishing gender-differential impacts and taking positive, affirmative action towards gender equality and equity. It is now widely acknowledged that gender considerations need to be reflected in all development plans, programmes and policies. There is growing concern over the isolation of women in so-called "soft" sectors in education, employment and development rather than mainstreaming gender concerns across all organizations, institutions and activities. While the concerns are clearly articulated,

national goals and the UN millennium/sustainable development goals cannot be achieved without concrete effort towards gender equality.

Achieving gender equality and gender equity requires multi-pronged approaches and strategies. One of the key approaches and strategies revolves around design and development of suitable educational programmes that equip practitioners and policy makers with the requisite knowledge and skills to make a valuable contribution in this sphere. The Master's/ Postgraduate Diploma programmes would make an excellent foundation for analyzing, critically assessing existing development interventions and promoting gender-sensitive/gender-based research and action. The strong focus envisaged on positive affirmative action would be of considerable significance.

## 2.24 Master of Arts (Women and Gender Studies) (MAWGS) School of Gender & Development Studies (SOGDS)

Women's & Gender Studies are emerging and growing areas of academic inquiry today. The modular MAWGS programme is aimed at students with a Bachelor's degree in any discipline with an interest in this area. The programme will acquaint students with the academic area of women's and gender studies and its history, theoretical premises and progression to present day status. It is expected that learners who have completed the MA programme would have a deeper understanding of formulations of empowerment. They would have been exposed to cultural, literary, political and socioeconomic dimensions within gender frameworks through either one of the two specialisations. This degree will equip students with the ability to deconstruct the complex power hierarchies and relationships operating in society, from the perspective of women and gender.

### Career Options

Students completing the Master's Degree will be able to pursue higher studies and research programmes, find employment with government agencies, corporate sector, advocacy assignments through national and international non-profit organisations, pursue careers in teaching, writing, editing, mass media or opt for other appropriate career options.

### Modular Structure and Specializations

This is a 66 credit two year programme. The first year consists of core, foundational courses which will equip learners with an analytical and critical understanding of theoretical and conceptual issues related to women's and gender studies in an inter-disciplinary context. Due to the progressive nature of the programme, students are required to complete the core foundation courses to be offered sequentially in semester 1 and semester 2 before proceeding further. Learners who successfully complete the requirements of the 34 credit first year curriculum (32 credits of coursework + 2 credits for Project Work) may exit with P.G.Diploma in Women's & Gender Studies. Thus, learners may exit at this point or continue for the 2nd year to earn the MA degree in Women's & Gender Studies.

After completion of the first year curriculum, learners may choose one of two specializations namely, "Gender, Literature & Culture" or "Women's Studies". The courses offered in the third and fourth semesters will be specific to the individual specializations. The specialization in "Gender, Literature and Culture" will enable students to familiarize themselves with salient topics in the humanities from the perspective of gender. Courses in third and fourth semesters will enhance their critical understanding of important issues such as marginalized cultural spaces, relationship between gender and the nation, gender and discourse (especially literary), and the mutually constructive relationships between literature, culture and society. The specialization in "Women's Studies" will expose students to multidisciplinary approaches of addressing historical and contemporary women's issues. It will equip the students in conceptualizing and developing analytical skills required to understand women's issues through theory, praxis, research and practicum.

**Duration:** Minimum 2 years and Maximum 5 years; offered only in July cycle of admissions.

## 2.27 Master of Science(Mathematics with Application in Computer Science) (MSCMACS)<sup>@</sup> School of Sciences (SOS)

This programme has the following broad objectives:

- to emphasise the relevance and usefulness of mathematics from an application point of view;
- to equip the learners with the core mathematical knowledge and training necessary for use in many application areas;
- to expose the learner to real life problems and promote the use of mathematics in industry and applied sciences;

- to develop a work force that is equipped with the mathematical skills that are necessary in the changing industrial and economic scenario of the country;
- to develop human resource in emerging disciplines such as Mathematical Biology, Computational Mathematics, Mathematical Economics, etc.;
- to promote collaborative research with industry and other user agencies.

#### Eligibility:

- <sup>a</sup> Graduate with a Major, or Honours in Mathematics with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

#### If the seats at a centre remain vacant then:

These core courses which you will be studying during the first two semesters of your studies, will prepare you well to study the courses offered during the third and the fourth semesters.

#### Elective Courses

The elective courses will expose you to the applications of mathematics in the area of computer sciences.

#### Project

Project work is compulsory for all of you. It aims to provide hands on work experience in some Industry/Organizations/R&D establishment/Institution. The project guide will give you all the details related to the project work.

#### Practical

Most of the courses of the programme have computer practical component. Practicals session will be held at the programme centres. Attending and completing the practical sessions is compulsory for each student. The total number of practical sessions per semester ranges from 11 to 36. The sessions are spread over the entire semester. In order to be eligible for attending the Term-end-Examination of the practicals in a course, the student has to complete **at least** 70% of the practical sessions prescribed for the course.

#### Scheme of Study

In order to enable you to complete your M.Sc (MACS) programme within the minimum period of two years, you will have to take 16 credits worth of courses in each of the four semesters. Registration to the programme is semester-wise. After the first/second/third semester, irrespective of whether you pass or not in all the courses of a semester, you have to register for the second/ third/fourth semester courses respectively, by submitting the Course Registration Form with the requisite programme fee.

### 3.5 Bachelor of Business Administration (BBARL) School of Management Studies (SOMS)

The Programme is of 96 credits comprising of all compulsory courses with an Internship and On the Job Training in the first, second and third year respectively. The programme is offered with modular approach as given below:

### 3.6 Bachelor's Preparatory Programme (BPP) <sup>^^</sup> **\*(On Hold)** School of Social Sciences (SOSS)

Bachelor's Preparatory Programme (BPP) - Non-Formal Channel to B.A./B.Com/BSW

Bachelor's Preparatory Programme is offered by the University to those students who wish to do Bachelor's Degree of IGNOU but do not have the essential qualifications of having passed 10+2 and attained the age of 18 years/as on 1st April and 1st October for January & July session respectively. In the absence of such a qualifying certificate these students are deprived of higher education. To enable such students to enter higher education stream, IGNOU has designed this preparatory programme. BPP is, however, not equivalent to 10+2 and has no credit weightage. It is valid for admission to IGNOU's non-formal stream of BA/ B.Com. etc.

**Eligibility:** No Formal Qualification, Minimum age - 18 years. The applicant should complete 18 years of age by 1<sup>st</sup> April for the preceding January session and 1<sup>st</sup> October for preceding July session of the year.

BPP is a Bridge Course (**non-credit course**) of six months duration for those who do not have 10+2, but attained the age of **18 years** as on 1<sup>st</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> October and **seeking admission** in the preceding January and July sessions respectively. BPP is valid for **seeking admission only to IGNOU's first degree B.A./B.Com** etc. under **non-formal stream (non 10+2 stream)**.

At no stage BPP is treated as equivalent to 10+2. It is also not equivalent to Matric. No Certificate is issued on successful completion of BPP.

**UGC Regulations, 1985** (Notification No.F.1-117/83(CP) dated **25<sup>th</sup> Nov.1985**) published in the Gazette of India regarding **minimum standards of instructions for the grant of first degree through non-formal/distance education** in the faculties of Arts, Humanities, Fine Arts, Music, Social Sciences, Commerce and Sciences, prescribed the minimum age limit of 21 years. The age limit has been brought down to **18 years** for admission to the First Degree under non-formal/distance education in the said faculties through another Notification No.F.1-117/83(CPP-II) dated **18<sup>th</sup> Oct.1995** published in the Gazette of India by University Grants Commission.

2. Provide the learners with the information and skills necessary to understand and analyse their world,
3. Enable the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
4. Impart reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
5. Expose the learner to the importance of interdisciplinarity.

**Eligibility** : 10+2 or its equivalent or BPP from IGNOU

**Medium of Instruction** : English & Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Learners opting B.A. Psychology courses with Practicum component are required to pay an extra fee of Rs.600/-**

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Degree, a learner has to complete 132 credits in minimum six semesters

(three years) with 22 credits per semester. The 132 credits of the programme have to be earned by completing the following categories of courses:

- Core Courses(CC)
- Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- Generic Electives (GE)

A learner can choose any two disciplines from the above twelve disciplines for completing BA programme. Once the two disciplines are chosen in the first semester, he/she has to take Core Courses and Discipline Specific Elective Courses from those two Disciplines ONLY in all the subsequent semesters as per the following Programme Structure Template:

#### School of Tourism and Travel Management (SOTHSM)

The University offers Bachelor Degree Programme in Vocational Studies in Tourism Management. The Programme has been developed by the School of Tourism and Hospitality Services Management.

#### Objectives:

The Programme seeks to provide an opportunity to large segment of the population including the disadvantaged to pursue a programme on tourism and travel. The programme is for creating a dedicated and skilled workforce in the Travel and Tourism Sector. The people working in the tourism sector, self-employed, other adults who wish to upgrade their educational qualification and knowledge in the tourism sector will be benefitted with this programme. The programme will provide University level education in new fields of knowledge and niche areas which fulfil the demands of employment and economy of the country.

**Eligibility:** 10+2

**Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years, Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 12000/- for full programme to be paid Rs.4000/- per year

The B.A. (Voc) Tourism Management Programme is of 132 credits spread over six semesters (Three years) with study load worth 22 credits in each semester. . In each semester, the students have to choose 4 courses in all from different categories of courses. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AEC and SEC are of 4 credits each. Therefore, the study load in each semester will come out to 22 credits. #### **School of Social Sciences (SOSS)**

The School of Social Sciences offers Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree Programme in the following Disciplines:

- 1) Economics
- 2) History
- 3) Political science

- 5) Public administration
- 6) Sociology

**Objectives:** With a substantial number of courses drawn from a single discipline, and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelors Honours programmes are designed to give an in-depth knowledge in a discipline while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline. The Honours programmes have the following objectives:

1. Introduce the learner to the main themes and topics in a discipline of humanities, social sciences and sciences with core and elective courses.
2. Facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent or BPP from IGNOU

**Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 Years, Maximum 6 Years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:**Rs. 9,600/- for full programme to be paid year wise @ Rs. 3,200/- per year.

Fee to be paid in 1st year, including Registration Fee of Rs.200/-is Rs.3,400/

**Learners opting B.A. Psychology Honours programme are required to pay an additional fee of Rs.600/-per year.**

To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a Discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in minimum six semesters (three years). The Honours programmes have a mix of following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Honours Degree, a learner has to complete 148 credits in minimum six semesters. The study load of the Honours programmes vary from semester to semester. Students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters. The distribution of different types of courses across the six semesters and their credit weightage is given in the Programme Structure Template below:

#### School of Social Sciences

The University offers Bachelor of Science (Honours) Degree in the Anthropology Discipline.

**Objectives:** With a substantial number of courses from the discipline of Anthropology and a few interdisciplinary and skill enhancing courses, this Bachelor of Science Honours programmes is designed to give an in depth knowledge in Anthropology while giving the learner an opportunity to explore subjects beyond the discipline. The Honours programme has the following objectives:

1. Introduce the students to main themes and topics in Anthropology.
2. Expose the students to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
3. Introduce students to reading and writing skills through assignments and dissertation project appropriate for undergraduate study.
4. Expose the students to the importance of interdisciplinary by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 Years, Maximum 6 Years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 15,600/- for full programme to be paid year wise @ Rs. 5,200/- per year. Fee to be paid in 1st year, including Registration Fee of Rs.200/-is Rs.5,400/

## 3.18 Bachelor of Arts English (Honours) (BAEGH)

### School of Humanities (SOH)

The University offers a Bachelor's Honours Degree Programme in English (**BAEGH**) in addition to a number of other disciplines. Information pertaining to the Programme is given below:

**Objectives (BAEGH):** With a substantial number of courses drawn from a single discipline (English), and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelors Honours programme (English) is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in that discipline while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline as well. The Honours programme has the following general objectives:

1. To introduce the learner to main themes and topics in the discipline of English through core, discipline-centric electives, ability/skill enhancement and generic courses.
2. To facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses in humanities and social sciences.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary study by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent or BPP from IGNOU

**Medium of Instruction:** English

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** A total of Rs. 9,600/- is to be paid year-wise for the full programme, @ Rs.3,200/year. Fee to be paid in the first year including a registration fee of 200/- is Rs.3,400/-.

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners' study time. To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in a minimum of six semesters (three years). The students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters.

The Honours programmes have a mix of courses. For earning 148 credits, a student has to study the following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (**CC**)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (**DSE**)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (**AECC**)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (**SEC**)
- e) Generic Electives (**GE**)

A learner can choose BA Honours programme in any **ONE** of the following Disciplines: Economics, English, Hindi, History, Political Science, Psychology, Public Administration, and Sociology. The study load of the Honours programmes varies from semester to semester. Once the Discipline is chosen, the learner has to take the courses under categories (a) Core Courses and (b) Discipline Specific Elective Courses from that Discipline **ONLY** in all the semesters.

#### Core Courses (CC)

The programme has 14 core courses. Each core course is of six credits. These courses cover more than half of the programme, 84 credits (14 courses x 6 credits) out of 148 credits of the programme.

#### Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs) are on offer in the fifth and sixth semesters of the programme. The 4 DSEs are specific (or specialized or advanced or supportive) to the discipline or subject of study and provide an extended scope. They are of 6 credits each (6 courses x 4 credits) and will thus be 24 credits in all.

### Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses are of four credits each. As the name suggests, the Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are compulsory for all learners. There are two AECCs on offer, one each in the first and second semesters. With one course in the first two semesters each, (2 courses x 4 credits), the AECC courses will add up to 8 credits in all.

### Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also ability enhancement courses. These are value-based and/or

skill-based courses and are designed to develop competencies and skills. Each Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is of four credits. These courses are on offer in the third and fourth semesters with a number of SECs on offer in each semester. Choose any **one** Skill Enhancement Course from the common pool that is available. One SEC in each semester (2 courses x 4 credits) will add up to 8 credits.

### Generic Electives (GE)

Generic Electives (GEs) are the other type of electives that are on offer in the first, second, third and fourth semesters of the programme and are of 6 credits each. These courses are inter-disciplinary in nature and provide an exposure to other disciplines/subjects. Choose any **one** Generic Elective from the common pool of GE that is available in each semester in which they are offered. With one course in each of the first four semesters, (4 courses x 6 credits), GE will come to 24 credits in all.

### SEMESTER-WISE COURSE OPTIONS

In each semester, the students have to study four 4 courses in all from different categories of courses except in the third and fourth semesters when the number of courses goes up to 5. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AECC and SEC are of 4 credits each. While the fourteen CCs are distributed across the six semesters, the four DSEs are available in the fifth and sixth semesters only. There will be a number of SECs and the GEs available in the common pool in each of the semesters in which they are offered. A student has to opt for only one GE for study in each of the first four semesters and one SEC during the third and fourth semesters of the programme. The university will be adding new SECs and electives (DSEs and GEs) to the existing pool of courses from time to time. The study load in the first and second semesters will be 22 credits each and while the credit load in the third and fourth semesters will be enhanced to 28 credits each, it will come down to 24 credits each in the fifth and sixth semesters. ## 5.13 Post Graduate Certificate in Medical Management of CBRNE Disasters (PGCMDM)

### School of Health Sciences (SOHS)

The term CBRNE stands for 'Chemical Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive'. Disasters related to such agents can occur accidentally. However, when used intentionally they become agents of mass destruction.

CBRNE disasters are ill-understood, diagnosis is difficult and very little management tools exist to manage these disasters, including medical management. Medical management of CBRNE disasters require specific knowledge and skill set that is not covered in the undergraduate curriculum. India is particularly vulnerable to CBRNE attacks. Thus, society and governments need to create special provisions to deal with them.

In light of the above facts, IGNOU in collaboration with Institute of Nuclear Medicine and Allied Sciences (INMAS), Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and active support from Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) have developed a 6 months PG Certificate programme in Medical Management of CBRNE disasters through open and distance learning for MBBS doctors.

#### PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

After completing the programme, the learner should be able to:

- comprehend the parameters, enormity and complexity of CBRNE threat from a medical perspective
- describe the impact of chemical, radiological, biological, explosive and nuclear agents on human health
- assess the health effects of a CBRNE scenario using external and internal assessment tools
- discuss regarding the medical counter measures, detection equipments and SOPs of medical management of CBRNE impacts.
- deliver first aid and initiate immediate life saving responses to a CBRNE disaster
- develop competencies on protection, mitigation and medical management of CBRNE casualties
- get sensitized about the current R&D initiatives and future directions.

- Medical personnel & students engaged in or interested in disaster medical management

The CGCA program is thus a platform for gaining knowledge, to understand the activities and variety of care interventions that are required by an elderly patient.

## 6. UNIVERSITY RULES

The University reserves the right to change the rules from time to time. However, latest rules will be applicable to all the students irrespective of the year of their registration.

### 6.1 Educational Qualifications Awarded By Private Institutions

Any educational qualification awarded by the Private Universities established under the provisions of the "**Chhattisgarh NijiKshetra Vishwavidyalaya (Sthapana Aur Viniyaman), Adhiniyam, 2002**" are non-existent and cannot be considered for admission to any Academic Programme in IGNOU.

### 6.2 Validity of Degree for Admission

Master's Degree awarded without a first degree of Three-year duration is not recognised for purposes of admission to IGNOU's Academic Programmes. However, this condition is not applicable for the five-year Integrated Master's degree acquired from a recognized University/Institution.

Bachelor's Degree means, **Bachelor's Degree of not less than Three year duration.**

"Professional Degree" means a degree in Engineering, Law, Medicine, and Nursing etc.

### 6.3 Acceptance of 'Two year Bachelor's degree'

Students who had enrolled themselves in the first degree course prior to June 4, 1986 and students who had successfully completed their first degree course, prior to June 4, 1986, irrespective of their duration shall be treated at par with the students who have completed Three years degree and they are not required to undergo a further one year bridge course. Degrees obtained prior to June 4, 1986 and the degree awarded to the students enrolled upto June 1986, but completed subsequently shall be treated valid for all purposes including admission to a Masters degree programme and other higher studies.

IGNOU accepts First degree of Two year duration obtained from a recognized university **completed up to the year 1998-99** for purposes of higher studies; **provided such students have undergone a further one year bridge course and passed the same to be in conformity with UGC Regulations.**

'**One-sitting B.A. degree**' of Osmania University, Andhra University, Kakatiya University, Kurukshetra University, etc. **is recognized for purposes of admission to IGNOU's Master's Degree programmes subject to the condition that the candidates have enrolled for the programme up to the year 1995-96 and completed their course up to the year 1998-99.** Besides, such candidates should have a gap of two year after +2 before they have registered themselves for 'One sitting BA degree'.

Degrees acquired from an '**Off Campus' Centre of Private Universities** outside the territorial jurisdiction of the State concerned are **not** recognized for purposes of admission to IGNOU's academic programmes unless it has specific approval of the University Grants Commission.

Similarly, Degrees acquired through an 'Off Campus' Centre/ 'Off-shore' Campus of Central/State/Deemed to be Universities/Institutions of National Importance offered through Open and Distance learning (ODL) mode will be accepted for purposes of higher studies in IGNOU; provided these have been obtained as per territorial jurisdiction of these Central/State/Deemed to be Universities/Institutions of National Importance prescribed by the University Grants Commission from time to time.

### 6.4 Incomplete and Late Applications

Incomplete Online Application Form(s)/Re-registration Form(s), received having wrong options of courses or electives or false information, will be summarily rejected without any intimation to the learners. The learners are, therefore, advised to fill up the relevant columns carefully and provide clear/visible scanned copies of all the required self attested certificates. If required by the University to submit the application form in "Offline Mode" in some specific programmes or due to some others specific reasons, the application form sent through Offline mode to offices of the University other than the one specified, will not be considered and the applicant will have no claim, whatsoever, on account of this.

### 6.5 Validity of Admission

Learners offered admission have to join on or before the due dates specified by the University. In case they want to seek admission for the next session, they will have to apply afresh and go through the admission process again.

### 6.6 Simultaneous Registration

Students who are already enrolled in a programme of one year or longer duration can also simultaneously register themselves for any **Certificate programme of Six months duration**. However, if there is any clash of dates of counselling or examination schedule between the two programmes taken by the student, University will not be in a position to make adjustment.

However simultaneously pursuing **two academic Programmes** at degree level, either from the same University, or one from the **Open University** (under **ODL mode**) and the other from **Conventional University (regular or face-to-face mode)** is not permitted, as of now.

### 6.7 Re-Registration

Learners are advised to submit the Re-Registration (RR) forms 'Online' only on the web portal [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in). as per schedule being notified by the University from time to time, irrespective of the fact that whether the learners appeared in the examination or not or whether they are passed or not in the course(s) registered in the current academic session. If the Re-Registration in any of the programme is not available online or for any other reason as specified by the University, Learners should submit their RR forms at the respective Regional Centre ONLY and nowhere else. If any student submits the 'Offline' Re-Registration Form at any other Regional Centre than the allocated Regional Centre, and consequently misses the scheduled date and a semester/ year, he/she will have no claim on the University for regularization.

International students of the University pursuing their programme from India are advised to submit re-registrations form Offline at respective Regional Centre or International Division, HQ.

### 6.8 Re-admission

The students who are not able to complete their programme within the maximum duration can take re-admission for additional period in continuation of the earlier period as under:

For re-admission the student has to remit **pro-rata fee** for each incomplete course. The Table of pro-rata fee and the Re-admission Form is available at the Regional Centres and also on the website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)> Student Zone > Downloads > Re-admission >).

Students who do not register/re-register for all the years/semesters of a Programme and fail to pay the prescribed full Programme fee during the maximum duration of the Programme are also eligible for Re-admission; provided they pay full fee for the missed year(s)/ semester(s) as per rate applicable for the session for which they seek re-admission, in addition to the **pro-rata course fee for re-admission** as per rate given in the Table for each of the course(s) they failed to successfully complete within the maximum period prescribed.

### 6.9 Additional time for Learners with Disability

- a) Learners-with disability of 40% or more are given additional 2 (two) years beyond the maximum duration prescribed for all academic programmes.
- b) Learners with disability—seeking benefit of the aforesaid facility should submit the 'Disability Certificate' issued by the competent authority at the Regional Centre concerned, which, in turn will verify it, make entry in the data base and transmit the data to SRD for updating in the Master records.
- c) Re-admission facility to learners with disability will be extended without charging any pro-rata fee, i.e. further extending the duration beyond the maximum duration by six months/ one year/ two year, as the case may be. However, learners with disability are required to submit Re-admission Form, as per schedule, without any pro-rata fee.

### 6.10 Reservation

The University provides reservation of seats for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, non-creamy layer of OBC, Economically Weaker Sections, (as notified by MHRD vide OM 12-4/019-U1 dated January 2019), War Widows, Kashmiri Migrants and Physically Handicapped learners, as per the Government of India rules, for admission to its various programmes. However, submission of forged certificate under any category shall be liable not only for cancellation of admission but also to be legally implicated as per Government of India rules.

### 6.11 Scholarships and Reimbursement of Fee

The learners belonging to reserved categories, viz. Scheduled Castes; and Scheduled Tribes, fee reimbursement facilities as per the rules of the University. Jail inmates are provided full fee exemption.

The learners belonging to above categories admitted to IGNOU Programme(s) are eligible for Government of India Scholarships. They are advised to collect Scholarship forms from the Directorate of Social Welfare or from the office of the Social Welfare Officer of their State, fill it up and submit the duly completed Scholarship Form to the Regional Director at the Regional Centre (where he/she stands admitted/registered for the programme, he/she applied for admission) for necessary certification by the Regional Director.

After the above certification, the Scholarship Form be collected back from the Regional Centre and re-submitted at the office of the Social Welfare Officer or Directorate of Social Welfare in their State, as the case may be, for scholarship or reimbursement of Programme Fee.

Scholarship scheme of National Centre for Promotion of Employment of Disabled People (NCPEDP) for Post Graduate level programmes is applicable to the students of this University also. Such students are advised to apply to the awarding authority directly.

**Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/Minority/PWD can avail scheme of fee waiver/ reimbursement/ exemption/scholarship offered by UGC/MHRD/various State Governments/ Govt. Departments. For eligibility and procedural details, interested students may obtain details from concerned agencies.**

### 6.12 Fee Reimbursement for SC/ST Students under the SCSP and TSP Schemes

The University provides reimbursement of programme fee to students from SC/ST category as per its policy. The policy is subject to modification. Students are advised to visit the University website or contact the Regional Centre to know about the latest provisions.

The SC and ST students who are employed or who are availing any kind of fellowship or fee exemption from other agencies are not eligible for fee exemption under SCSP/TSP scheme. The exemption of fee is confined to Programme Fee mentioned in this Admission Prospectus. The scheme will not exempt registration fee, late fee (if any), term-end-exam fee, re-admission fee, convocation fee etc.

The application form is provided at the end of the Prospectus at **Annexure IV**.

### 6.13 Refund of Fee

The refund request will be considered as under:

- a. Before the last date for submission of admission form-the fee paid will be refunded after deduction of Rs.200/-
- b. Within 15 days from the last date for submission of admission form-the fee paid will be refunded after

deduction of Rs.500/-

**c.** Within 30 days from the last date for submission of admission form-the fee paid will be refunded after deduction of Rs.1,000/-.

**d.** After 30 days from the closure of the last date- No refund will be allowed.

**e.** The last dates for submission of admission form will be considered separately i.e. last date without late fee and last date with late fee. However, late fee, if any, will not be refunded.

**f.** In cases of (a) to (c) above, the candidate will make a written request to the Regional Director concerned for such a refund. The RC will process the cases as soon as possible after ascertaining the credit of the same in IGNOU Accounts.

**g. For CBCS Based Bachelor's Degree Programme:**

The registration of the students will be done year-wise though the courses of the programmes will be offered semester-wise. The students will pay the fee for the first and second semesters at the time of admission itself. No fee will be refunded if a student decides to withdraw mid-session.

**6.14 Waiver of IGNOU Programme fee for Jail Inmates**

Inmates lodged in Prisons in the country are exempted from payment of programme fee, including registration fee. The under-trial/short term prisoners are also eligible for the same benefit of FREESHIP as is extended to other prisoners with the condition that when they go out of jail, they will be treated as normal students and shall pay subsequent fees wherever applicable (examination fee, re-registration fee, pro-rata fee for readmission, registration fee for convocation etc.).

**6.15 Study Material and Assignments**

The University has a provision to provide soft copy of the self-learning material in place of printed material. A learner opting for the soft copy will be given a discount of 15% in the Programme Fee. The Option to this effect has to be indicated by the learners while filling in the Online Admission Form. Such learners will not be given printed self-learning material.

The University sends study material to the students by Registered post/ Speed Post and if a student does not receive the same for any reason; whatsoever, the University shall not be held responsible for that. Assignments for the current session are made available on the website. Students are advised to download the same.

For non-receipt of study material, learners are required to write to the Registrar, Material Production and Distribution Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi – 110 068

**6.16 Change of Elective/Course**

For CBCS Based Bachelor's Degree Programme, change of course is **NOT permitted** in CBCS-Based BAG/ BCOMG and BSCG Programmes. **For Master's Degree Programme, the fee for change of course is Rs.600/- for 2/4 credits and Rs.1200/- for 6/8 credits course.** Payment should be made by way of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of "IGNOU" payable at the place of concerned Regional Centre. All such requests for change of Elective/Course should be addressed to the concerned Regional Centre only as per schedule.

**6.17 Change of Medium**

For CBCS Based Bachelor's Degree Programme, Change of medium will be allowed as per current practice on payment of applicable fee.

For other Programmes Change of Medium is permitted within 30 days from the receipt of first set of course material **in the first year ONLY, on payment of Rs.350/- plus Rs.350/- per 2/4 credit course and Rs.700/- per 6/8 credit course for undergraduate courses. For Master's Degree Programme it is Rs.350/- plus Rs.600/- per 2/4 credit course and Rs.1200/- per 6/8 credit course.** Payment should be made by way of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of "IGNOU" payable at the place of concerned Regional Centre. All such requests for change of Medium should be addressed to the **concerned Regional Centre only**, as per schedule.

**6.18 Change of Programme**

Change of Programme is **NOT permitted** in CBCS-Based BAG,BCOMG and BSCG Programmes.

For other Programmes Change of programme in Master's Degree (MEG/MHD/MPS/MAH/MPA/MSO/MEC/MARD/M.Com./ MAPY/MAPC) is permitted only in the first year of study within 30 days from the last date of applying for admissions. A student has to pay the full fee for the new Programme and he/she has to forgo the fee paid for the earlier programme.

The request for change of programme should be addressed to the Regional Director of concerned Regional

Centre.

### 6.19 Credit Transfer

Credit transfer means allowing a student of another university to get admitted to IGNOU for completing any equivalent degree/diploma programme on the basis of credits obtained by him/her from that University. A student thus admitted need not write IGNOU examinations for such courses which are found equivalent to and for which appropriate credits would be deemed to have been acquired for, and for purposes of fulfilling the IGNOU requirements for award of a degree/diploma.

Students who want to avail of credit transfer shall get registered with IGNOU for the programmes they want to study. All the applications for this purpose should be addressed to The Registrar, Student Registration Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi-110068.

There will be **NO credit transfer available** for the CBCS based programmes w.e.f. July 2019 session.

### 6.20 Counselling and Examination Centre

All study centres, Programme study centres, special study centres are not Examination centres. Practical Examination need not necessarily be held at the centre where the learner has undergone counselling or practicals.

### 6.21 Correction of Address and Study Centre Change

There is a printed proforma for change/correction of address and change of Study Centre provided in the Programme Guide given/sent to the admitted learners along with the study material in the very first lot of despatch. In case there is any correction/change in the address, the learners are advised to make use of that proforma and send it to the Regional Director concerned who will make necessary corrections in the database and transmit the corrected data to Registrar, Student Registration Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi-110068. **Requests received directly at SRD, New Delhi, or any other Office of the University will not be entertained. The form of change of address can also be downloaded from IGNOU Website [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in).** Learners are advised not to write letters to any other officer in the University in this regard. Normally, it takes 4-6 weeks to effect the change. Therefore, the learners are advised to make their own arrangements to redirect the mail to the changed address during this period. In case a change of Study Centre is desired, the learners are advised to fill the Proforma and address it to the Regional Centre concerned. Since counselling facilities are not available for all Programmes at all the Centres, learners are advised to make sure that counselling facilities are available, for their subjects, at the new centre they have opted for. Request for change of Study Centre is normally accepted subject to availability of seat for the programme at the new centre asked for. Change of Address and Study Centre are not permitted until admissions are finalized.

### 6.22 Change of Region

When a learner wants transfer from one region to another, he/she has to write to that effect to the Regional Centre from where he/she is seeking a transfer marking copies to the Regional Centre where he/she would like to be transferred to. Further, he/she has to obtain a certificate from the Coordinator of the Study Centre from where he/she is seeking transfer regarding the number of assignments submitted. The Regional Director from where the learner is seeking the transfer will transfer all records including details of fee payment to the new Regional Centre under intimation to the Registrar, Student Registration Division (SRD) and the learner as well. For change of Region in practical oriented Programmes like computer programmes, B.Sc. etc., 'No Objection Certificate' is to be obtained from the concerned Regional Centre/Study Centre where the learner wishes his/her transfer.

In case any learner is keen for transfer from Army/Navy/ Air Force Regional Centre to any other Regional Centre of the University during the cycle/session, he/she would have to pay the fee-share money to the Regional Centre. In case the learner seeks transfer at the beginning of the session/cycle, the required programme course fee for the session/cycle shall be deposited at the Regional Centre. However, the transfer shall be subject to availability of seats wherever applicable.

The learner can seek transfer to any other overseas study centre only after six months of Registration or submission of first year/semester assignments for the programme of one year or longer duration.

### 6.23 Eligibility for Term End Examinations

The learners are instructed to **refer to Page No. 12, para 1.10** Evaluation System sub-head 'Term-end

**Examination and Payment of Examination Fee'** before submitting Examination Form for appearing in the June as well as December Term-end examination. A learner having exhausted the maximum duration of a programme should not apply for appearing at the Term-end examination of any course without getting re-registered/sought readmission for the same. Otherwise, the result would be withheld in such cases.

The students seeking admission to CBCS based Bachelor Degree Programme in July 2019 admission session will be allowed to appear for the term end examinations for all the courses of first and second semesters together in June 2020 TEE only. Subsequently, as per the existing practices they will be allowed to appear in both December and June term end exam to complete their courses. Students can appear for the TEE for only those courses for which the student has opted and has submitted the assignment within the stipulated period.

## 6.24 Foreign Students

Foreign students residing in India having valid student visa for the minimum duration of the programme are eligible to seek admission in IGNOU's selected programmes on payment of international fee applicable for them. For programme fee and other charges the student can visit "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" icon on IGNOU's website or contact the Director, International Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi 110 068. Admission of foreign student residing in India will be processed by the International Division of the University after ensuring their antecedents from the Ministry of External Affairs/ Ministry of Human Resource Development. Programmes with limited number of seats are not offered to foreign students.

## 6.25 Guidelines for Admission in respect of International Students residing in India

- a) Download the Admission form for the respective Programme from IGNOU's website [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)
- b) Fill up all the columns of the Admission forms and attach the relevant documents (as mentioned in the Prospectus) along with fee and cost of Prospectus.
- c) Submit the hard copy of the form along with documents and fees at the following address  
Director, International Division, IGNOU, Block No. 15. Section K, Maidan Garhi. New Delhi.
- d) The learner must fill all the Columns of the Admission Form, failing which the admission form will not be processed for admission. The complete applications should reach at the above address not later than the last date of submission of forms.
- e) The learner may apply only for those courses for which International fees have been prescribed.
- f) The learner will have to produce the valid STUDY VISA for the minimum duration of the programme. Presently, the students from Nepal and Bhutan are not required to submit the Study Visa.
- g) The learner will have to remit the International Fees of Programme.
- h) The fee has to be remitted through Bank Draft favouring "IGNOU" payable at "New Delhi".
- i) The learner should possess the minimum qualification specified for the Programme. However, for equivalence of the qualification of the candidate reference may be made to Booklet "Equivalence of Foreign Degrees" published by Association of Indian University. In case the Degree/Certificate possessed by the candidate is in a language other than English or Hindi, a translated copy duly verified by the concerned Embassy should be submitted.
- j) The fees once paid will neither be refunded nor transferred. However, in cases where University denies admission, the programme fee will be refunded through A/c Payee Cheque only.
- k) The student needs to submit NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE from the concerned embassy. In the letter it should be clearly written that the Embassy has no objection regarding study of the concerned student in IGNOU as well as extension of visa from time to time. PIO / OCI Card holders are not required to submit the NOC from concerned Embassy.

- m) PIO/OCI card holders and also Refugees (UNCHR) Card Holders will pay the fee applicable to International Students.

### 6.26 Official Transcripts

The University provides the facility of official transcripts on request made by the learners on plain paper addressed to Registrar, Student Evaluation Division (SED), Block 12, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi-110068. The fee for official transcripts is as under:

### 6.27 Improvement in Division/Class

Keeping the interest of students who have completed their Bachelor's / Master's Degree programme, but falling short of 2% marks for securing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Division the University has made a provision for all owing such students to improve their performance. The improvement is permissible only in theory papers and the student may apply for improvement of their performance on the prescribed application format along with a fee of Rs.750/- per course, a bank draft drawn in favour of IGNOU payable at New Delhi and submit the application and fee to the Registrar, Student Evaluation Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi -110068.

### 6.28 Early Declaration of Result

A learner can apply for early declaration of Term-End-Examination result with a fee of Rs. 1000/- per course. **The application for early declaration of result shall be entertained only if the student has been selected for any post or applied for further studies.** The student must compulsorily submit documentary evidence (proof) in support of the reason for early declaration of result to the concerned Evaluation Centre whose details are available on the University website.

Early Declaration is permissible in Term-End-Examination only. This facility is not applicable for Lab/ Practical courses, Project, Assignment, Workshop, Seminar etc. based courses. The Application for Early Declaration of result shall be entertained for final year only.

### 6.29 Re-evaluation of Term-End-Examination

After the declaration of result, if the learner are not satisfied with the marks awarded, they can request the University to re-evaluate their Answer Scripts on payment of Rs.750/- per course. The request for re- evaluation by the learner-must be made **within one month** from the date of declaration of result to the concerned Evaluation Centre in the prescribed format alongwith the fee of Rs.750/- per course in the form of Demand Draft in favour of IGNOU payable at the city of the Evaluation Centre where submitting the Re-evaluation form. Format is available in the Programme Guide or IGNOU website: [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in).

### 6.30 Obtaining Photocopy of Answer Scripts

After the declaration of result, if the learner are not satisfied with the marks awarded, they can request the University for obtaining Photocopy of Answer Scripts on payment of Rs.100/- per course. The request for obtaining Photo copy of Answer Scripts by the learner must be made within 45 days from the date of declaration of result to the concerned Evaluation Centre in the prescribed format along with the fee of Rs.100/- per course in the form of Demand Draft in favour of IGNOU payable at the city of the Evaluation Centre where submitting the Photocopy form. Format is available in the Programme Guide or IGNOU website:[www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)

### 6.31 Duplicate Grade Card

The learner can apply for obtaining duplicate Grade Card in case of lost/misplaced/damaged by paying through DD of Rs.250/- in favour of IGNOU payable at "New Delhi". Format is available in the Programme

Guide or IGNOU website: [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)

### 6.32 Change of Category

Please note that any request for change of category code shall not be entertained by the University after finalization of admissions. Similarly, for the entrance test based and merit based programmes, request for change of category will not be entertained once the Forms are finally submitted by the prospective learners.

### 6.33 Correction/Change of Name/Surname of Learner

Spelling mistakes, if any, committed at the time of data entry stage will be rectified at the Regional Centre and corrected data transmitted to Student Registration Division for updating in the database. However, Learners are expected to write their correct name (as indicated in the High School Certificate) in the Admission Form. In case any change in the name (other than the one mentioned in his/her High School Certificate), then it is mandatory for the prospective learners to furnish legal evidence of having changed his/her name/ surname while submitting the admission form.

For Change of Name/Surname, after confirmation of admission, the learners are required to submit the following documents at the Regional Centre, for onward transmission to Registrar, SRD:

- Original copy of Notification in a daily newspaper notifying the change of name;
- Affidavit, in original, on non-judicial Stamp Paper of the appropriate value sworn in before 1st Class Magistrate specifying the change in the name;
- Marriage Card/Marriage Certificate in case of women candidates for change in surname;
- Gazette Notification, in original, reflecting the change of name/surname;
- Demand Draft of Rs.500/- drawn in favour of IGNOU payable at NewDelhi.

### 6.37 Pre-admission Counselling of Persons with Disabilities

### 6.38 Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions

Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of India, vide their Office Memorandum F.No. 12-4/2019-UI, dated 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, on the subject cited above, has conveyed that in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and in reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational Institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions

contained in the OM No. 20013/01/2018-8C-11 dated 17th January, 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment subject to the condition mentioned in the Office Memorandum of MHRD (copy enclosed) .

In light of above, I am directed to request the Schools of Studies and concerned Divisions/Centers and Units of the University, as under:

- a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in the University from the academic year 2019-20 onwards beginning academic session July 2019.
- b) Every School of Study, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in Clause (c) of section 2 of the Central Educational Institutions (Reservations in Admissions) Act, 2006), as well as Authorities of the University, will increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty (wherever, the number of seats are fixed) so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of MHRD O.M., i.e. Academic session July 2019 onwards.
- c) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the University as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March, 2019.

The application form is provided at the end of the Prospectus at **Annexure I** .

### 6.39 Digital Study Material

The University has digitized the study material for different programmes. The digitized material is available on eGyankosh, the digital repository of the University.

The University encourages the use of digital study material. It has been decided that as an incentive **15% concession shall be given to the students who opt for digital study material in place of printed study material.**

### 6.40 KVS Employees

As per the agreement with Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), One hundred students are entitled to get 50% fee concession in the programmes offered by the University during a year. All the KVS employees seeking admission may send their applications alongwith the requisite full programme fee directly to the Concerned Regional Centres without routing through IGNOU HQs. However the employees may follow the rules and procedures laid down by the KVS HQs, New Delhi, as regards to obtaining permission etc. The reimbursement in fees of 50% will be made only to such candidates duly recommended by the KVS HQs to SRD, IGNOU HQs. The reimbursement will be made by the concerned Regional Centre of IGNOU, on getting the communication only from Student Registration Division (SRD), IGNOU HQs.

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

As you are aware, the Open Universities have been established in the country by an Act of Parliament or State Legislature in accordance with the provisions contained in Section 2(f) of University Grants Commission Act, 1956. These universities are, therefore, empowered to award degrees in terms of Section 22 (1) of the UGC Act, 1956.

It has been brought to the notice of the Commission that the students who have done their M.A. from open universities are debarred by universities from registration for Ph.D. studies. This is most unfair in view of the importance attached to the Open University and distance learning in National Policy on Education, 1986. The Programme of Action-92 also aims at promoting the mobility of students among open universities and among the traditional universities. This can be made possible only when there is a workable understanding between open universities and traditional universities for recognition of each other's degrees on reciprocal basis. A Memorandum of Understanding has already been signed between University of Pondicherry and Indira Gandhi National Open University which provides for recognition of each other's degrees and diplomas as well as transfer of credits for courses successfully completed by students between the two universities. The other universities may also make similar arrangements so that the mobility of students from Open University stream to traditional universities is ensured without any difficulty.

I hope that your university will make necessary efforts in this direction and let the Commission know the progress.






Sir/ Madam,

There are a number of Open and Distance Learning Institutions (ODLIs) in the country offering Degree/ Diploma/Certificate programmes through the mode of non formal education. These comprise Open Universities, Distance Education Institutions (either single mode or dual mode) of Central Universities, State Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Institutions of National Importance or any other Institution of Higher learning recognized by Central/State/Statutory Council/Societies registered under the Society Registration Act 1860.

2. A circular was earlier issued vide UGC letter F1 No- 52/2000(CPP-II) dated May 05, 2004 (**copy enclosed**) mentioning that Degrees/Diplomas / Certificates/ awarded by the Open Universities in conformity with the UGC notification of degrees be treated as equivalent to corresponding awards of the traditional Universities in the country.

3. Attention is also invited to UGC circular No F1-25/93(CPP-II) dated 28<sup>th</sup> July 1993 (**copy enclosed**) for recognition of degrees and diplomas as well as transfer of credit for courses successfully completed by students between the two types of universities so that the mobility of students from Open University stream to traditional universities/ institutions is ensured without any difficulty.

4. The Government of India, in exercise of its power conferred under section 20(1) of UGC Act 1956, issued directions dated 29<sup>th</sup> December 2012 entrusting UGC with the responsibility of regulating higher education programme in open and distance learning (ODL) mode. Consequently, Universities/ Institutions desirous of offering any programme through distance mode would require recognition of UGC.
5. As you are aware, the Government of India has envisaged a greater role for the Open and the Distance Education System. The envisioned role may be fulfilled by recognizing and treating the Degrees / Diplomas/ Certificates awarded through distance mode at par with the degrees obtained through the formal system of education. Open and Distance Education System in the country is contributing a lot in expansion of Higher Education and for achieving target of GER, without compromising on quality. Non recognition/ non equivalence of degrees of ODL institutions for the purpose of promotion/ employment and pursuing higher education may prove a deterrent to many learners and will ultimately defeat the purpose of Open and Distance Education.
6. Accordingly, the Degrees/ Diplomas/ Certificates awarded for programmes conducted by the ODL institutions, recognized by DEC (erstwhile) and UGC, in conformity with UGC Notification on specification of Degrees should be treated as equivalent to the corresponding awards of the Degree/Diploma/Certificate of the traditional Universities/ institutions in the country.



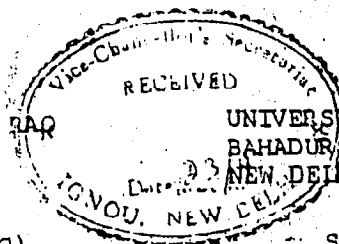

Dear Mr. Vice-Chancellor,

The University Grants Commission at its meeting held recently considered the relaxation of conditions for participation of lecturers in the Refresher Courses/Summer Institutes for placement in senior scale/selection grade/Reader.

The Commission had constituted a Standing Committee to look into the matter and make recommendations accordingly.

On the recommendations made by the Standing Committee, the Commission has taken the following decisions:

- (1) It was decided that the following courses/programmes will be recognised as equivalent to Orientation/Refresher Courses:
  - (a) P.G. Diploma in English conducted by CIEFL, Hyderabad may be considered as equivalent to two refresher courses in English.
  - (b) P.G. Diploma in Higher Education conducted by I.G.N.O.U. New Delhi may be considered as equivalent to one Orientation Course for teachers of various disciplines. This course may be considered as equivalent to two Refresher Courses for teachers of Education.
  - (c) The P.G. Diploma in Distance Education of I.G.N.O.U. may be considered as equivalent to two Refresher Courses for teachers of Distance Education in various Universities.
  - (d) The Masters Degree in Subject Communication conducted by Yashwant Rao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik may be considered as equivalent to two Refresher Courses in the respective disciplines.
  - (e) The Masters Degree in Distance Education of Yashwant Rao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik may be considered as equivalent to two Refresher Courses for teachers of Distance Education.
- (2) S.E.R.C. and other schools organised by Universities on behalf of D.S.T. in various disciplines which are of three to four weeks' duration may be considered as equivalent to one Refresher Course in that particular or related discipline.
- (3) The Summer Institutes of about six weeks' duration conducted in different disciplines by various universities under the aegis of the University Grants Commission may be considered as equivalent to one Refresher Course in that particular discipline.
- (4) The courses such as Indo-British Workshop conducted by E.M.R.C., Ahmedabad (six-weeks' duration), Indo-French Workshop organised at M.C.R.C., New Delhi (four weeks' duration), Indo-American Workshop organised at CIEFL, Hyderabad (four weeks' duration), may be treated as equivalent to one Refresher Course specially for the faculty

working in various media centres who are in the Lecturer's scale of Rs. 2200-4000 for the purpose of Career Advancement.

(5) The Course on "An Integrated Approach to Knowledge & Information for University and College Teachers" conducted by National Institute of Advanced Studies, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore may be recognised as equivalent to an Orientation Course.

I shall be grateful if you kindly bring the decisions to the notice of all concerned.

## प्रेस नोट

राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी के प्रचार-प्रसार और विकास की दिशा में स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं का महत्वपूर्ण योगदान रहा है। स्वतंत्रता प्राप्ति के बाद इन संस्थाओं में हिन्दीतर क्षेत्रों में हिन्दी को लोकप्रिय बनाने के लिए काफी प्रयत्न किये हैं। इसी परिप्रेक्ष्य में कुछ स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं द्वारा संचालित हिन्दी परीक्षाओं को भारत सरकार में मान्यता प्रदान की है। ताकि लोगों को हिन्दी का ज्ञान हो सके और इसके माध्यम से रोजगार प्राप्त कर सके। भारत सरकार ने हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति की सिफारिश और संघ लोक सेवा आयोग की सहमति से इन संस्थाओं द्वारा आयोजित कुछ परीक्षाओं को 1960 से मान्यता देना शुरू किया ताकि इन परीक्षाओं को पास करने पर उम्मीदवार उन सरकारी नौकरियों के लिए पात्र बन सकें, जिनके लिए हिन्दी की योग्यता भी जारी की गई है। इस विषय पर कई प्रेस विज्ञप्तियाँ भी जारी की गई हैं। समय-समय पर अस्थायी मान्यता की अवधि भी बढ़ाई जाती रही है। बाद में कुछ संस्थाओं की परीक्षाओं को स्थायी मान्यता दी गई है। यद्यपि अभी कुछ संस्थाओं को अस्थायी मान्यता दी गई है।

हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति भारत सरकार में एक स्थायी संस्था है। यह समिति हिन्दी के प्रचार, प्रसार और विकास के संबंध में भारत सरकार को समय-समय पर सलाह देती है और सिफारिशें करती है। इस समिति की सिफारिशों के आधार पर स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं की परीक्षाओं को मान्यता प्रदान की जाती है।

किसी भी स्वैच्छिक संस्था को चाहे वह स्वयं हिन्दी की परीक्षा आयोजित करती हो, या किसी भी मान्यता प्राप्त अन्य स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्था के माध्यम से परीक्षा संचालित करती हो, मान्यता प्राप्त करने के लिए अखिल भारतीय हिन्दी संस्था संघ, 24, कोटला मार्ग, नई दिल्ली की मान्यता के लिए प्रस्ताव भेजना होता है। इस प्रस्ताव के आधार पर संस्था संघ परीक्षा की मान्यता संबंधी मानदण्डों और नियमों के अनुसार उस संस्था का निरीक्षण करता है और मान्यता के लिए मंत्रालय को अपनी सिफारिश भेजता है। इसके बाद मंत्रालय का अधीनस्थ कार्यालय केन्द्रीय हिन्दी निदेशालय की एक निरीक्षण समिति स्वतंत्र रूप से उस संस्था का निरीक्षण बनती है और अपनी रिपोर्ट हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति के विचार के लिए मंत्रालय की प्रस्तुत करती है।

कुल समाचार पत्रों में परीक्षा शीर्षक के अधीन यह समाचार छपा होता है कि हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन प्रयाग (इलाहाबाद) की प्रथमा और मध्यमा परीक्षा को क्रमशः एस.एस.सी. और बी.ए. के समकक्ष मान्यता दी गई है। इस प्रकार के समाचार का स्पष्टीकरण इस मंत्रालय से समय-समय पर दिया जाता रहा है। कुछ वर्ष पहले उप शिक्षा मंत्री, श्री पी.के. थुंगन ने भी लोकसभा में स्थिति स्पष्ट की थी और बताया था कि हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन की वास्तविक स्थिति भिन्न है क्योंकि यह एक स्वैच्छिक संगठन है न कि विश्वविद्यालय अथवा विश्वविद्यालय समझी जाने वाली संस्था। यह शिक्षा राज्य परीक्षा परिषद तथा विश्वविद्यालय के समान नहीं माना जाता है। इसलिए इस संस्था द्वारा आयोजित इन परीक्षाओं को केन्द्र सरकार द्वारा हाई स्कूल, इंटरमीडिएट और बी.ए. के बराबर मान्यता नहीं दी गई है। इस संस्था को केवल हिन्दी विषय की परीक्षा को संचालित करने की मान्यता दी गई है, भले ही, यह हिन्दी के साथ-साथ अन्य विषयों को भी तैयार करता हो।

पुनः यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि किसी पद के लिए निर्धारित किए गए हिन्दी स्तर के निर्धारण के प्रयोजन से हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन की प्रथमा और मध्यमा परीक्षाओं को क्रमशः एस.एस.एल.सी. तथा बी.ए. के बराबर से मान्यता दी गई है।

इसी प्रकार अन्य स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं द्वारा संचालित हिन्दी परीक्षाओं की मान्यता के बारे में भी कहा जा सकता है कि ये परीक्षाएँ न तो किसी राज्य परीक्षा परिषद और न ही विश्वविद्यालय के समकक्ष मानी गई हैं। जहाँ तक सरकारी नौकरियों के लिए इन परीक्षाओं की मान्यता का प्रश्न है, इस सम्बन्ध में यह निश्चय किया गया है कि यदि सरकारी अथवा गैर सरकारी कार्यालय, अर्ध सरकारी संस्था या शैक्षिक संस्था में किसी पद के लिए हिन्दी की कोई विशेष योग्यता निर्धारित की गई है तो इन परीक्षाओं से प्राप्त की गई योग्यताधारी व्यक्ति इन पदों के पात्र हो सकते हैं। परन्तु हिन्दी की अलग से यदि कोई योग्यता निर्धारित नहीं की गई है तो स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्था से प्रमाणपत्र या डिग्री प्राप्त करने वाले व्यक्ति विश्वविद्यालय या राज्य परीक्षा परिषदों के प्रमाणपत्र या डिग्री की समकक्षता का दावा नहीं कर सकते हैं।

अतः उपर्युक्त विवरण के आधार पर, संक्षेप में पुनः स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं की मान्यता केवल संलग्न सूची में दर्शायी गई समकक्ष परीक्षा के लिए निर्धारित हिन्दी स्तर तक ही सीमित है और इसे पूर्ण प्रमाण-पत्र या डिग्री परीक्षा के बरोबर नहीं माना जायगा। आम जानकारी के लिए संस्थावार मान्यताओं का विवरण संलग्न है।
