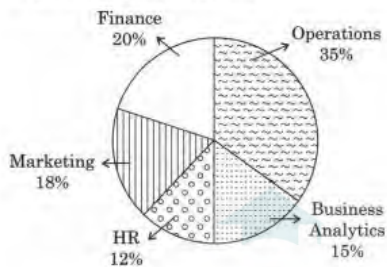

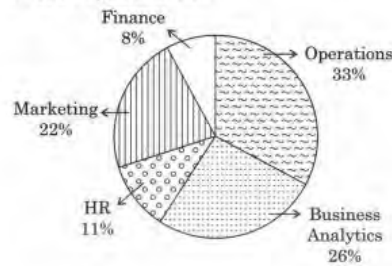
Break up of number of students studying in different specialization of management college and the number of students who recently got placed in each specialization.

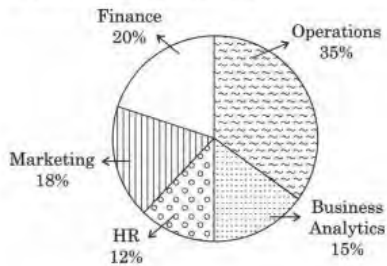

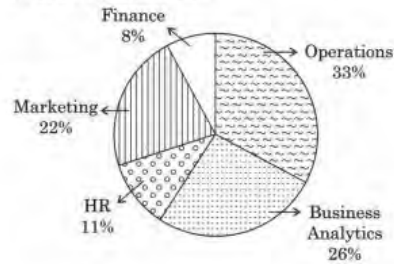

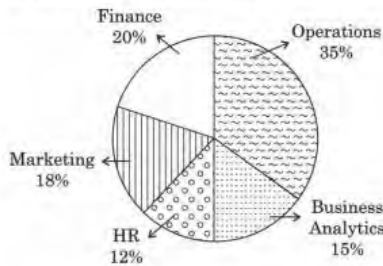

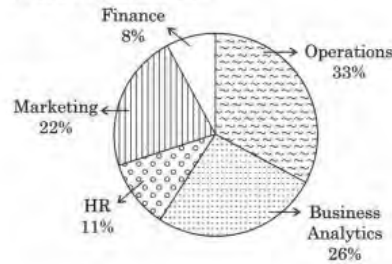

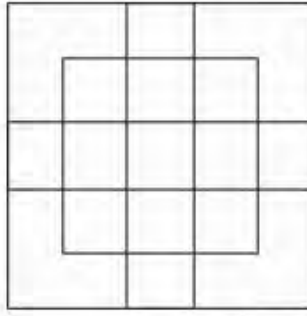

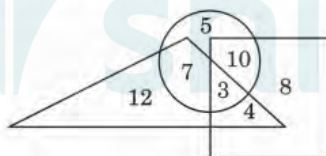

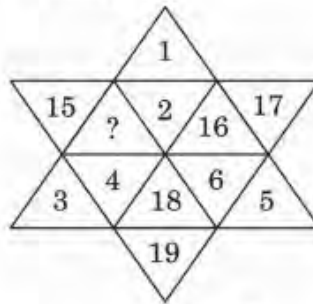
