#### Note:

- 1. The distribution of seats for PG MD/MS/DNB courses in government and private medical colleges will be displayed separately for the academic session 2025–26 once updated by the NMC or MCC.
- 2. Those Contract GDOs who have not completing the mandatory service duration and want to apply under Direct Quota shall have to submit an Affidavit claiming that if selected they will produce a relieving letter from the government at the time of admission.
- 2. DNB seats shall be allotted to only regular GDOs of the state of H.P, Not to contract GDOs.

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# Chapter 1 Introduction & General Instructions

#### 1. Scope and Authority

- The Department of Medical Education and Research, Himachal Pradesh shall conduct the online Common / Centralized Counselling for admission to PG (MD/MS/DNB) degree courses for the academic session 2025–26.
- 2. Counselling covers **50% State Quota** PG seats in Government Medical Colleges and **all seats** in Private Medical Colleges of the State.
- 3. The Controller of Examinations, Atal Medical & Research University (AMRU), Mandi at Ner Chowk, acting as Member Secretary, Common/Centralized Counselling Committee, will prepare the State Merit List on the basis of NEET-PG-2025 results and any applicable service incentives supplied by the Directorate of Health Services (DHS), H.P.
- 4. Admissions will be made only to courses **recognized/ permitted** by the **National Medical Commission (NMC)**, **National Board of Examinations (NBE)**, and AMRU, in accordance with applicable NMC and State Government rules.

#### 2. Affiliated and Included Colleges

- 1. Government medical colleges affiliated to AMRU (admissions through this counselling):
  - o Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla
  - o Dr. R.P. Govt. Medical College, Kangra at Tanda
  - o Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Govt. Medical College, Mandi at Ner Chowk
  - o Dr. Y.S. Parmar Govt. Medical College, Nahan
  - o Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru Govt. Medical College, Chamba
  - o Dr. R.K. Govt. Medical College, Hamirpur
- 2. **Maharishi Markandeshwar Medical College (MMMC), Kumarhatti, Solan** affiliated to Maharishi Markandeshwar University, Solan is included **only for seat allotment** through this Common/Centralized Counselling, based on AMRU's NEET-PG-2025 merit list, in compliance with directions from the Hon'ble Supreme Court / MoHFW / NMC.
  - Note: College-specific details (bond conditions, stipend, college & hostel fees, registration and exam charges, exam schedule) will be provided in MMMC&H's separate prospectus. Candidates intending to take admission there must consult MMMC&H's prospectus in addition to this State Prospectus.

#### 3. Duration of Course

• PG Degree Course (MD/MS/DNB): 3 years

#### 4. Availability of Prospectus and Important Websites

• Candidates must download and **read the entire Prospectus** before applying.

#### 5. Application — Process & Mandatory Steps (step-by-step)

- 1. **Apply online** on the prescribed application form within the dates published in this Prospectus. Applications are accepted **online only** via **www.amruhp.ac.in**.
- 2. **Pay the application fee** through the specified online payment gateway. Fee payment is mandatory for successful submission.
- 3. After successful payment, **obtain and print the confirmation copy** of the online application form. Generation of the confirmation copy confirms successful submission.
- 4. On the day of reporting to the provisionally allotted college, candidates must produce the **printed confirmation copy** along with requisite certificates/documents **in person**.

#### 6. What Constitutes an Incomplete or Rejected Application

- 1. The online application will be **incomplete and liable to rejection** if:
  - o Any required step of online registration is not completed, or
  - o The application fee is not successfully paid, or
  - o A confirmation copy is **not** generated.
- 2. **Mere deduction of fee** from the candidate's account does **not** imply successful submission a confirmation copy must be generated.
- 3. The Counselling Committee is **not responsible** for failure of fee transfer or non-generation of the confirmation copy.

#### 7. Eligibility to Apply (Qualifying Criteria)

- Minimum qualifying percentiles in NEET-PG-2025 for eligibility to participate in Common/Centralized Counselling:
  - o General (UR): 50th percentile
  - o SC / ST / OBC (including persons with benchmark disability): 40th percentile
  - o UR Persons with Disability (PwBD): 45th percentile

**Important:** Candidates who are **not qualified** in NEET-PG-2025 should not apply. Applications of non-qualified candidates will be rejected without notice. **Application fees are non-refundable.** 

#### 8. State Merit List and Admissions

- 1. AMRU will prepare and display the **provisional State Merit List** of qualified candidates who have applied online with successful fee transaction.
- 2. The **final State Merit List** for applicants who have submitted complete applications will be displayed as per the schedule in this Prospectus.
- 3. All admissions and seat allotments will be based strictly on the State Merit List, applicable reservation rules, and the counselling procedure.

#### 9. Candidate Ineligibility & Consequences

• Any candidate found **ineligible at any stage** shall have **no claim** for admission or continuation in the PG (MD/MS/DNB) course, even if they have qualified NEET-PG-2025.

#### 10. Counselling Schedule, Notifications & Candidate Responsibility

- 1. **Online counselling** will be conducted as per the schedule published in this Prospectus or as updated by the Common/Centralized Counselling Committee.
- 2. **No separate individual intimation** will be sent. Candidates are responsible for **regularly checking** the official websites given in Section 4 for schedules, notices, and updates.

#### 11. Seat Changes, Additions, Deletions

- The number of seats/courses may be added, altered, or deleted as per recommendations or directions of the Government of India / National Medical Commission / National Board of Examinations.
- 2. The number of seats may be **increased or decreased** depending on exigencies or directions from competent authorities.
- 3. Any PG seat(s) left unfilled in a regular session will not be carried forward to the next or any subsequent academic session.

#### 12. Stray Vacancy / Admitted Candidate Rule

• In accordance with the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's directions dated **09.05.2017** in *Writ Petition (Civil) No. 267/2017 — Dar-Us-Slam Educational Trust & Ors. vs. Medical Council of India*, candidates **admitted on any seat at the end of the 3rd round of counselling** whose names appear on the **MCC portal** under the "Admitted Candidates" category **shall not be considered** for allocation in the **Stray Vacancy Round** by the Common/Centralized Counselling Committee.

#### 13. Jurisdiction

• All matters and disputes connected with PG (MD/MS/DNB) Counselling are subject to the **jurisdiction of the Courts at Shimla only**.

#### 14. Prospectus Review Authority

• The Prospectus Review Committee / Counselling Committee for PG (MD/MS/DNB) reserves the right to **insert, amend, modify, or delete** any clause of this Prospectus at any stage of the counselling process and to issue corrigenda, notices, or updates as deemed necessary.

# CHAPTER 2 ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA

#### 2.1 General Eligibility Conditions (Applicable to All Categories)

All candidates seeking admission to MD/MS/DNB courses in the State of Himachal Pradesh, irrespective of the quota applied for, must fulfill the following minimum requirements:

- **2.1.1** Possess an MBBS Degree or Provisional MBBS Pass Certificate recognized by the National Medical Commission (NMC) or the erstwhile Medical Council of India (MCI).
- **2.1.2** Have **completed compulsory rotating internship** on or before **31st July 2025**, as prescribed in the Information Bulletin issued by the **Directorate General of Health Services (MCC/DGHS)**, New Delhi, for the academic session 2025-26.
- **2.1.3** Hold permanent or provisional registration with the National Medical Commission (NMC) or a State Medical Council (SMC).
- **2.1.4** Have qualified NEET-PG 2025 conducted by the National Board of Examinations (NBE), obtaining at least the minimum qualifying percentile prescribed by the NMC for the respective category.
- **2.1.5** Admissions to all categories of seats—State Quota, Management Quota, and NRI Quota—shall be made **strictly through the Common/Centralized Counselling** conducted by the designated authority of the State Government/University. **No direct admission** at the institutional level is permissible.
- 2.2 Eligibility and Selection Criteria for In-Service GDOs (66.67% of all HP State Quota seats)
- **2.2.1** Eligibility and selection of **In-Service GDO candidates** shall be governed by the **Government of Himachal Pradesh Notification No. HFW-B(F)4-9/2017-II-L dated 15.10.2025**, and as amended from time to time.
- **2.2.2** In-Service GDO candidates **shall not be eligible** for admission against **Management Quota seats** in Private Medical Colleges within the State.
- 2.3 Eligibility and Selection Criteria for Direct Candidates ((33.33% of all HP State Quota seats))
- **2.3.1** Candidates who have obtained their **MBBS degree from Medical Colleges located in Himachal Pradesh** shall be eligible to apply under the **Direct Quota** for 50% State Quota seats.
- **2.3.2** Candidates shall fulfill all general eligibility conditions specified in Clause 2.1 above.
- **2.3.3** Candidates working on **regular or contract basis** but **not possessing the requisite qualifying service** as defined in the State PG Policy shall be treated as **Direct Candidates**, provided they satisfy all other prescribed conditions.
- **2.3.4** Candidates applying under the Direct Category, including those covered under Clause 2.3.3, shall submit an **affidavit duly attested** by a competent authority on non-judicial stamp paper, in the format provided at **Appendix-3**.
- 2.4 Eligibility and Selection Criteria for Management Quota Seats (Private Medical Colleges)
- **2.4.1** All **Indian Nationals** who fulfill the general eligibility requirements stated in Clause 2.1 shall be

eligible to apply for Management Quota seats in Private Medical Colleges of Himachal Pradesh.

**2.4.2** Admission under the Management Quota shall be made **strictly on the basis of NEET-PG 2025 merit** through the **Common/Centralized Counselling** conducted by the University or State Counselling Committee.

#### **2.4.3** Candidates must produce the following **original documents** at the time of admission:

- (a) MBBS Degree/Provisional Certificate
- (b) Internship Completion Certificate (31 July 2025 or earlier as per MCC/NMC)
- (c) NEET-PG 2025 Admit Card and Result Card
- (d) NMC/SMC Registration Certificate
- (e) Proof of Date of Birth and Identity
- (f) Any other document as specified by the Counselling Authority

#### 2.5 Eligibility and Selection Criteria for NRI Quota Seats (Private Medical Colleges)

**2.5.1** Eligibility for admission under the **NRI Quota** shall be determined in accordance with: (a) The judgment of the **Hon'ble Supreme Court of India** dated **22.08.2017** in W.P. (Civil) No. 689 of 2017 – Consortium of Deemed Universities in Karnataka (CODEUNIK) & Anr. vs. Union of India, and (b) The judgment of the **Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh** dated **13.11.2020** in CWP No. 4119 of 2020 – MMU, Solan vs. State of H.P.

#### 2.5.1 NRI Category

(i) The applicant shall be an **NRI citizen** in his/her own right; **or** (ii) The applicant's **parent(s)** (including legally adopted parents) shall be **NRI(s)** with sufficient annual income to support the candidate's education.

**Note:** All tuition and related fees shall be remitted **through foreign bank transactions in US Dollars** (\$) only.

#### 2.5.2 NRI Sponsored Category

In the event that adequate eligible NRI candidates are not available, **NRI Sponsored candidates** may be considered subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The **sponsor must be a blood relative** of the applicant—brother/sister or their children; maternal/paternal uncle or aunt or their children; or maternal/paternal grandparents. A **genealogical-tree certificate** issued by a **Tahsildar or higher authority** shall establish the relationship.
- (b) The **sponsor must possess valid NRI/OCI/PIO status**, supported by an NRI Status Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy or competent authority, and provide a copy of **passport with valid visa**.
- (c) The sponsor must have **adequate annual income** to support the candidate's course of study.
- (d) Sponsors holding temporary or visiting visas are not eligible.

#### 2.5.3 Required Documents

#### (a) For NRI Candidates:

- NEET-PG 2025 Result Card
- MBBS Degree / Final Prof. Marks Sheet
- Proof of Date and Place of Birth
- Proof of Citizenship

#### (b) For Parents (of NRI Candidates):

- NRI/OCI/PIO/Residency Certificate issued by Indian Embassy or competent authority
- Employment or Business Certificate showing nature of work and annual income
- Copy of Income Tax Returns for the previous financial year

#### (c) For NRI Sponsored Candidates:

• NEET-PG 2025 Result Card and MBBS Degree

- Proof of Date and Place of Birth
- Genealogical Tree Certificate
- Documents of Sponsor: NRI Status Certificate, Passport with valid Visa, and Employment Certificate

#### 2.5.4 Selection Criteria

- (i) A separate merit list shall be prepared for NRI candidates based on NEET-PG 2025 rank/score, and admissions shall be made through Common/Centralized Counselling.
- (ii) After admission of all eligible NRI candidates, any remaining vacancies shall be filled from among eligible NRI Sponsored candidates in order of merit-cum-preference.

# Chapter 3 Distribution of seats

The distribution of seats for PG MD/MS/DNB courses in government and private medical colleges will be displayed separately for the academic session 2025–26 once updated by the NMC or MCC.

**Note 1:-** As per National Medical Commission, New Delhi Notification F. No. CDN-19012/5/2023-Coord-NMC dated 29.12.2023 Chapter III Clause 3.1 (IV) all the PG (MD/MS) seats will be considered as recognized.

**Note 2:-** In compliance of office order No. HFW-H(I)B-(3)PG.P/2022-2733 from the Principal Secretary (Health) to the Govt. of HP, no seat will be allotted to In-service GDO candidates in MMMCH, Solan in the subject of Community Medicine.

# Chapter 4

### **Reservation and Documents**

#### 4.1 Reservation Policy and Roster System

(i) Admissions to MD/MS/DNB courses shall be made on the basis of **NEET-PG 2025 merit-cum-choice of specialty**, applying the **40-point and 6-point reservation rosters** as approved by the Government of Himachal Pradesh and the **National Medical Commission (NMC)**.

#### (a) 40-Point Reservation Roster

The 40-point roster shall determine allocation of seats/specialties among categories as under:

Sr. No.	II( 'atagary	40-Point Roster Points (Vertical Reservation)
1	Scheduled Caste (15%)	1, 8, 14, 22, 28, 36
11		4, 17, 31
3	Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD, 5%)	20, 40
4	Economically Weaker Sections (EWS, 10%)*	9, 19, 29, 39

<sup>\*</sup> Subject to NMC approval for 10% EWS seat enhancement. If an EWS roster point coincides with a GDO point, it shall be allotted to the **Unreserved (General)** category.

Note: The 40-point roster was applied separately to DNB seats from academic session 2024–25 onwards.

#### (b) 6-Point Reservation Roster

For each specialty, seats shall be distributed between **In-service GDOs** and **Direct Quota** candidates through a six-point cycle as follows:

#### **Roster Point Category**

1	In-service GDO
2	Direct Quota
3	In-service GDO
4	In-service GDO
5	Direct Quota
6	In-service GDO

Thus, 2nd and 5th roster points are reserved for Direct Quota, and 1st, 3rd, 4th and 6th for In-service GDOs.

(ii) If a candidate belonging to a reserved category (SC/ST/PwBD/EWS) secures a place in the **General Combined Merit List**, he/she may claim a seat under the **General category** on merit; the corresponding General roster point shall then be treated as **exhausted**.

#### (iii) Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the annual sanctioned intake shall be reserved for PwBD candidates in accordance with the **Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016**, and relevant **NMC** directives, based on **NEET-PG 2025** merit.

Admissions under PwBD shall follow **NMC Notification No. NMC/UGMEB/PwBD/2025 dated 19.07.2025**. (**Appendix-7 (A**)) For State Quota admissions, disability certification shall be issued by the designated medical boards at:

- Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Shimla; and
- Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College & Hospital, Kangra at Tanda.

If PwBD seats remain vacant due to non-availability of eligible candidates, such seats shall be **converted to the General category** in the subsequent counselling round.

#### (iv) Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

EWS eligibility shall follow Government of Himachal Pradesh (Dept. of Personnel AP-III) Letter No. PER(AP)-C-B(12)-1/2019 dated 11.06.2019. Candidates not covered under SC/ST/OBC and whose family gross annual income is below ₹4.00 lakh shall be identified as EWS (income includes all sources for the previous financial year).

**Exclusion criteria** (irrespective of income):

- Family ownership of more than 1 hectare agricultural land (rural) or 500 m<sup>2</sup> urban land;
- Residential house/flat > 2500 sq. ft;
- Family of an income-tax payer;
- Family of **regular/contract employees** of Central/State Government, Boards, Corporations, Autonomous Bodies, or PSUs.

#### **Notes:**

- For 2025–26, EWS reservation shall be implemented per Central Government directives. A
  proposal for 10% EWS seat enhancement has been submitted to the Board of Governors in
  supersession of MCI.
- 2. EWS claimants must submit the prescribed certificate (Appendix-6) issued by the competent authority of Himachal Pradesh.
- 3. As **EWS** quota is not applicable in Private Medical Colleges, any EWS roster point falling in a private institution shall be allocated to General category.
- 4. If EWS seats remain vacant after Round III of counselling, they shall be converted to the General category and allotted on merit.

(v)One seat each in Govt. Medical Colleges has been reserved for Single Girl Child category as per approval conveyed by the Government vide letter No. HFW- B(B) 12-4/2013-loose dated 11.10.2017. The reservation will be provided to single girl child in the following manner:

"If, single girl child category candidate stands in General Combined Merit list then she can opt for any seat that falls under general category points by virtue of her general combined merit. In that event point of general category will be treated exhausted. If, single girl child category candidate does not stand in the general combined merit, in that event last seat of general category of the concerned government Medical College which will be available during the Counseling shall be allotted to the single girl child to maintain the reservation to single girl child".

#### (vi) **Definitions of Single Girl Child:**

Single Girl Child means parents having a single girl child without any sibling subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria as prescribed for State Quota seats, under this, category, the candidate has to produce to a certificate as per Appendix-5.

#### 4.2 Documents Required for Registration and Counselling

Candidates shall upload **scanned**, **legible copies** of the following documents, as applicable, on the designated counselling portal during registration for **PG** (**MD/MS/DNB**) Counselling – 2025. All uploads must include an attested photograph.

- 1. Matriculation or equivalent certificate (proof of date of birth)
- 2. Final Professional (Part-II) marks sheet and MBBS degree (proof of qualification)
- 3. Character certificate from the college last attended
- 4. Internship completion certificate
- 5. Attempt certificate
- 6. Valid registration certificate (NMC / SMC)
- 7. NEET-PG 2025 result card
- 8. Bonafide Himachali certificate (Direct Group) Appendix-1
- 9. SC / ST certificate, if applicable Appendix-2
- 10. Affidavit (original), if applicable Appendix-3
- 11. Incentive certificate —
- 12. Disability certificate, if applicable Appendix-7
- 13. Single Girl Child certificate, if applicable Appendix-5
- 14. EWS certificate, if applicable Appendix-6
- 15. Proof of admission through NEET or any other All India Examination, if applicable
- 16. Diploma certificate, if applicable
- 17. Regular/contract service certificate(s) showing full particulars of service
- 18. Any other relevant certificate, if applicable

# Chapter 5 Instructions for Filling Online Application Form

Candidates seeking admission to **PG** (**MD/MS/DNB**) Courses – 2025 must apply online through the University website <a href="https://www.amruhp.ac.in">www.amruhp.ac.in</a> by selecting the following path:

Menu  $\rightarrow$  Admission  $\rightarrow$  Apply for Admission and Counselling  $\rightarrow$  PG MD/MS/DNB, or through the direct link available on the home page.

**Note:** Candidates must ensure their eligibility before proceeding with registration and submission of the online application form for PG (MD/MS/DNB) counselling.

#### 5.1 Registration

- Candidates are advised to use a laptop or desktop computer with the latest version of Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, or Internet Explorer for a smooth registration and choice-filling experience.
- 2. Use an **authenticated mobile number** and a **unique e-mail ID** (not previously registered in the AMRU system). The credentials generated after registration must be retained carefully for all future logins.
- 3. Candidates must fill details such as **Admission Quota**, **Category**, **Candidate's Name**, **Father's Name**, **NEET-PG Roll Number**, **Email ID**, and **Mobile Number** exactly as per the **NEET-PG 2025 record**.
- 4. After entering the email ID and mobile number, candidates must verify both by entering the **OTP** received on the registered email and mobile number.
- 5. After successful verification, enter the **captcha code** and click "**Register**" to complete the process.

#### **5.2 Payment Details for Admission**

- 1. Payment of the application fee **does not constitute completion** of the application. Candidates must fill and **finally submit** the online form after successful payment.
- 2. **Online application fee is non-refundable** under all circumstances; candidates must remit it cautiously.
- 3. If **ineligibility** of a candidate is detected at any stage, their candidature/application shall stand **cancelled without notice**.
- 4. Candidates are themselves responsible for any error, incorrect entry, or incomplete submission.
- 5. Applications found **incomplete or unpaid** shall be **summarily rejected** without prior intimation.
- 6. Queries regarding eligibility or examination must be settled **before** the counselling process.

8. If a candidate deposits the **wrong fee** or makes an erroneous payment, the amount **will not be refunded or adjusted**. Hence, the payment process should be executed carefully.

#### **5.3** Filling the Online Application Form

The application must be filled **step-by-step** on each screen. After submission, candidates should **download and print** the application form for their records.

#### **5.3.1 Personal Details**

- Enter personal information (Name, Father's Name, Date of Birth, etc.) exactly as per the **NEET-PG records**.
- Any discrepancy may result in cancellation of candidature at any stage.
- Particulars such as **Date of Birth, Category, State of Domicile, and Qualification** shall be treated as final. No request for modification will be entertained later.
- The responsibility for the accuracy of all information lies solely with the candidate.

#### 5.3.2 Photograph and Signature

- Photograph must be recent (taken on or after 1st October 2025) and up to 40 KB in size.
- Face coverage should be 80%, with ears visible and background plain white.
- Spectacles are allowed only if worn regularly. Caps and goggles are not permitted.
- Signature should be in **running handwriting** (**not capital letters**) on white paper using **black ink**, scanned up to **20 KB**.
- Both photo and signature must be in **.JPEG/.JPG format** and clearly visible.
- Uploaded images will appear on all official documents including **Registration Card, Admit Card, Evaluation Form, and Degree Certificate**.

#### **5.3.3** Management Quota Option

- All eligible **State Quota candidates** must also fill the **Management Quota** option in the online application form.
- Management Quota seats will be considered only if the candidate fills corresponding college and quota choices during counselling.

#### **5.3.4 Address Details**

• Provide a complete **permanent and correspondence address**, including correct **PIN code**, **email ID, and mobile number**.

#### 5.3.5 Eligibility and Category Details

- Candidates seeking admission under any **reserved category** must select **only one category** while filling the application.
- No change of category shall be allowed after submission.
- However, selection against the **General category** on the basis of combined merit will not be prejudiced.

#### **5.3.6 Qualification Details**

• Enter details of MBBS Degree, University, Year of Passing, and Internship Completion Date as per official records.

#### **5.3.7 Uploading of Documents**

• Upload all relevant documents in clear, legible scanned copies in the prescribed format and size, as mentioned in Chapter 4 of this prospectus.

#### 5.4 Final Submission and Download of Application PDF

- 1. Candidates must verify their **eligibility** before final submission.
- 2. Payment of fee **alone** shall not be treated as submission of the application form. After payment, click on "Final Submit" and download the PDF of the completed application form.
- 3. Once finally submitted, **no editing or modification** of entries will be permitted.
- 4. For any correction, candidates must **submit a fresh application** with a new email ID. The earlier application will be deactivated upon written request to AMRU.
- 5. The application fee of the previous form will not be refunded or adjusted.

#### **5.5 Post-Submission Process**

1. After the closing date, all **incomplete**, **unpaid**, **or unsubmitted** forms shall be **automatically deleted** from the portal. Candidates who wish to participate in the **next round of counselling** must submit a **fresh application** with a **unique email ID** and repay the application fee.

#### 5.6 Document Verification and Additional Requirements

 AMRU may, at any stage of the admission process, ask candidates to submit original or scanned copies of any documents, whether uploaded earlier or not, in online or offline mode for verification.

#### 5.7 Exceptional Cases and Relaxation

AMRU reserves the right to allow completion of the application or choice filling process after
the official deadline in cases where the payment was received but the transaction remained
unsettled due to technical issues, subject to verification of payment records and at the sole
discretion of the University.

#### **5.8 General Instructions**

- No representation beyond the provisions of this Prospectus shall be entertained.
- For any correspondence, candidates must quote their **Application Form Number**, **NEET Roll Number**, **Name**, **Father's Name**, and **Full Postal Address**.
- The decision of **Atal Medical and Research University**, **Himachal Pradesh**, shall be **final and binding** in all matters related to admission and counselling.

### CHAPTER - 6

### COUNSELLING SCHEDULE AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

**Note:** Each round of counselling is conducted as an independent process. The rules applicable to one round shall not apply to another. Once a round of counselling commences, all candidates—whether fresh registrants or those allotted/admitted in previous rounds—shall be governed strictly by the rules of that particular round. Accordingly, the rules of Round-2 shall supersede those of Round-1 once Round-2 begins, and so on. The Mop-Up and Stray Vacancy Rounds shall likewise be governed by their respective provisions only.

#### 6.1. Vacancies

#### 6.1.1. Round-1 Vacancies

The category-wise total number of available seats shall be displayed before the commencement of Round-1 counselling.

#### 6.1.2. Round-2 and Subsequent Round Vacancies

- (a) **Clear-Cut Vacancies:** Seats that remained unallotted or vacant due to non-admission by candidates from previous rounds. These will be displayed prior to each round.
- (b) **Virtual Vacancies:** Seats that may arise due to up-gradation or change of college/course by candidates during the next round. These will not appear in the vacancy list but shall be considered during allotment.

Candidates are advised to fill choices of colleges, courses, and quota categories as per their preference—even if such seats are not displayed in the vacancy list—since vacancies may arise dynamically due to changeovers in earlier allotments.

#### 6.2. Token Amount

#### **6.2.1.** Token Money to be Deposited

*Note:* If a candidate wishes to opt for both State and Management Quota categories, the higher token amount shall be payable.

#### **6.2.2. Subsequent Rounds**

Candidates who have already deposited the token amount in any previous round and were not allotted any seat are not required to pay it again in subsequent rounds.

#### 6.2.3. Refund and Forfeiture

- Token amount shall be **refunded** if no seat is allotted in any round.
- It shall be **forfeited** if the candidate fails to join the allotted seat.
- For candidates allotted seats and admitted, the token amount shall be transferred to the concerned college upon verification.

- Refunds will be made only to the account from which payment was made. Candidates must provide correct account details at the time of filling the choices in the second and subsequent rounds and may be required to submit an online claim form if automatic refund fails.
- In cases of multiple payments, the fee for rounds where the candidate was not allotted a seat will be refunded, while fees for rounds where the seat was not joined will be forfeited
- Refund claims must be submitted within **six months of the last date of admission** for the academic session 2025-26, as notified by MCC.

#### 6.3. Eligibility Restrictions (as per NMC / DGHS Guidelines)

- 1. Candidates who have been **admitted to a seat through All India Counselling** conducted by MCC/DGHS up to **Round-3** shall **not be eligible** to participate in any State Counselling conducted by AMRU thereafter.
- 2. Similarly, candidates who have been admitted to a seat under State Counselling (AMRU) up to Round-3 shall not be eligible to participate in any Stray Vacancy Round.

Candidates who were **registered but not allotted**, **or allotted but did not join**, shall remain **eligible to participate up to Round-3**, subject to payment of requisite token amount and fulfilment of all other conditions.

#### 6.4. Preparation of State Merit List and Tie-Breaking Criteria

• In-Service (GDO) Candidates:

Tie in marks, after inclusion of service incentives, shall be resolved using the original NEET-PG 2025 merit rank (as issued by NBE).

#### • Direct Candidates:

Merit shall be determined strictly as per NEET-PG 2025 rank provided by NBE.

#### 6.5. Round-Wise Process

#### 6.5.1. Round-1

- 1. **Online Registration:** Candidates must register, pay the non-refundable registration fee, and fill and lock choices.
- 2. **Publication of Merit List:** Displayed on AMRU website (<a href="https://amruhp.ac.in">https://amruhp.ac.in</a>).
- 3. **Seat Allotment:** Category-wise allotment based on merit-cum-choice.
- 4. **Reporting:** Physical reporting with original documents to the allotted college.
- 5. **Upgradation:** Candidates wishing to upgrade to Round-2 must complete admission formalities in Round-1.
- 6. **Non-Joining:** Candidates failing to report within the prescribed time shall forfeit their provisional allocation.

#### 6.5.2. Round-2

1. Candidates already registered in Round-1 need not register again.

- 2. Fresh registration is open for new candidates only.
- 3. Combined merit list (fresh + existing) shall be displayed.
- 4. Fresh choice filling and locking with applicable token amount is mandatory.
- 5. Upgradation/Shifting from one course or college to another shall be allowed.
- 6. If no upgradation occurs, the candidate may retain the earlier seat.
- 7. Publication of seat allocation and reporting with original documents at the allotted college.
- 8. Candidates upgraded in Round-2 shall have **no claim** over the previous seat.
- 9. Provisional allotment automatically lapses after the last date of admission of the round.

#### 6.5.3. Round-3

- 1. Fresh registration is open for unregistered candidates.
- 2. Previously registered candidates need not register again.
- 3. Combined merit list to be displayed.
- 4. Fresh choice filling and locking required.
- 5. Upgradation/shifting permitted across colleges/specialties.
- 6. Conversion algorithm shall apply at the end of Round-3 (see Clause 6.6).
- 7. Candidates upgraded in Round-3 shall have no claim on earlier seats.
- 8. Non-joining after allotment in Round-3 shall render the candidate ineligible for further rounds.

#### 6.6. Conversion Algorithm (Applicable in Round-3)

At the end of 3rd round of Common/ Centralized Counselling, in case, the eligible candidate to the extent of reservation in any quota (Direct/GDO) are not available or seats remain unfiled, the vacant seat shall be filled by making them available to the respective reserved category of other quota (Direct/GDO). If seats remain vacant even after this process, the vacant seats shall be filled up by making them available to other categories as given below:

- a) Vacant **SC** seats  $\rightarrow$  filled by eligible **ST** candidates.
- b) Vacant ST seats  $\rightarrow$  filled by eligible SC candidates.
- c) If still vacant  $\rightarrow$  filled by **General/Unreserved** candidates.
- d) Vacant **PwD** seats  $\rightarrow$  filled by eligible **General** candidates.
- e) SC/ST candidates of other states shall be considered under General category for State Quota seats.
- f) There is no specific 40-point roster point for OBC; hence, **OBC candidates** shall be considered in **General category** as per combined merit.

Note: Since NRI quota is applicable only in private Medical College, hence left out NRI quota seats shall be converted to management quota and filled in 3rd round.

#### 6.7. Stray Vacancy Round

- 1. Candidates already registered need not register again.
- 2. New/fresh registration allowed for those not registered earlier (with full fee).
- 3. Combined merit list to be displayed.
- 4. Fresh choice filling and locking required.
- 5. No inter-shifting from one Medical College or Course to another Medical College or Course shall be allowed during the Stray Round of Counseling as per MCC guidelines. However, shifting for up-gradation of course and quota from Private Medical Colleges to Govt. Medical College in order of merit-cum choices/preferences of the course, college & quota shall be allowed
- 6. Allotment category-wise; leftover seats shall be converted per Clause 6.6.
- 7. Candidates not reporting shall forfeit their seat and will not be eligible for further rounds.

#### 6.8. Verification of Eligibility and Documents

Final eligibility shall be determined by the **Scrutiny Committee** constituted by the Principal of the concerned Medical College.

It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure the accuracy and authenticity of all information submitted.

Incorrect or false information shall lead to cancellation of candidature/admission at any stage without notice.

#### 6.9. Admission of Non-Himachali Candidates

If any State Quota seat remains vacant in the last round and no eligible candidate opts for it, such seat may be offered to a Management Quota candidate only after exhaustion of Management Quota seats, subject to the State Quota fee structure.

#### **6.10. Reporting and Medical Examination**

- 1. Selected candidates must report to the allotted college for physical verification and medical examination at their own expense.
- 2. Candidates found medically unfit shall not be admitted.
- 3. Migration certificate (for those from other universities) and University registration formalities must be completed post-admission.

#### 6.11. Miscellaneous

- The candidature of applicants with incomplete or invalid documents at the time of reporting shall be rejected by the College Scrutiny Committee.
- The decision of the **Director**, **Medical Education & Research**, **H.P.**, cum-Chairman, Common Counselling Committee, shall be final and binding.
- Provisional admission letters shall be issued online and available for download from <a href="https://amruhp.ac.in">https://amruhp.ac.in</a>.
- Any candidate found ineligible at any stage shall have **no claim for continuation** in the course.

# **Chapter 7 Admission**

- **7.1** The Common/Centralized Counselling for admission to Postgraduate (MD/MS) Degree courses in various specialties shall be conducted **online**.
- **7.2** The following documents are **mandatory** at the time of reporting for admission to the concerned Medical College. Admission will **not** be accepted without these documents:
- a. Provisional allotment letter along with a printout of the submitted application form.
- **b.** All educational certificates, including MBBS degree (in original), and other documents as per the provisions of this Prospectus.

### Chapter 8 – Fees and Hostel Charges

**8.1** As per Notification No. AMRU/Acad/General/2022/Vol-I/-2232-2239 dated 15.05.2024, "The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor is pleased to order that students with special needs having more than 40% disability, admitted in any course of study affiliated with AMRU, shall not be charged any fees."

### Chapter 9

# Utilisation of Student Tuition Fee, Hostel Fee, Admission Fee, Student Fund, Medical Fund, Dilapidated Fund and Sports Fund

**9.1** The funds collected from students, including Tuition Fee, Hostel Fee, Admission Fee, Student Fund, Medical Fund, Dilapidated Fund, and Sports Fund, shall be managed and controlled separately by the relevant committees, namely:

- College Council
- Students/Hostel Committee

These committees are responsible for maintaining proper accounts and ensuring the funds are utilized for the activities and welfare of the students.

#### 9.2 Permissible Utilisation of Funds

The funds may be utilized for the following purposes, subject to approval by the Principal or the concerned committee:

- 1. Purchase of machinery and equipment related to the academic study of medical students.
- 2. Purchase of furniture and other essential articles for student hostels and college facilities.
- 3. General expenditure for societies, clubs, associations, committees, sabhas, and other student-organized activities.
- 4. Education trips to places of historical, geographical, or cultural interest, including mountaineering trips, factory visits, and hospital visits.
- 5. Expenditure on community projects or social activities approved by the Principal.
- 6. Participation of students in debates, declamation contests, music, and dramatic competitions.
- 7. Hire of vehicles, carriage, loudspeakers, and provision of refreshments to players, prize winners, and guests for sports and other functions.
- 8. Conveyance and boarding charges for visiting lecturers, prominent citizens, poets, and artists approved by the Principal.
- 9. Travelling allowance to invited guests delivering lectures or presiding over convocation/prize distribution functions.
- 10. Expenditure for staff and students representing the college in sports or other contests outside the institution.
- 11. Travelling allowance to college teams and accompanying staff members on approved tours.
- 12. Daily allowance for staff and students representing the college in sports or other contests.
- 13. Refreshments and meals during friendly/university matches or visits of distinguished guests to college functions.
- 14. Purchase of sports equipment, maintenance of playgrounds (watering, levelling, clearing, turfing), and amenities for NCC if present.

- 15. Photographs of teams or executive members of the student union.
- 16. Expenses related to awarding college colours to distinguished players.
- 17. Purchase of stock registers, cash books, and other accounting material for maintaining fund records.
- 18. Postage, telegrams, telephones, and stationery related to student activities.
- 19. Award or prize distribution expenses during annual sports events or college convocation.
- 20. Medical assistance for members of sports teams when participating outside the institution.
- 21. Uniforms or equipment for members of various college teams.
- 22. Publication of the college magazine.
- 23. Repair of hostel furniture and other articles after constitution of a repair committee.
- 24. Hostel funds for repair, maintenance, and development of hostel facilities.
- 25. Payment of inspection fees and related expenditures for regulatory or affiliating agencies.
- 26. Any other educational activity connected with student welfare, as approved by the Principal.

# Chapter 10 Ragging

# 10.1. HIMACHAL PRADESH EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (PROHIBITION OF RAGGING) ACT 2009

- 1. No studentshall indulge in ragging in any form, within or outside the premises of an educational institution.
- 2. Any person if on prima facie evidence is found guilty will be suspended from the educational institution.
- 3. On Conviction be punished with imprisonment for term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend fifty thousand or with both.
- 4. Will be expelled from the College/Institution.
- 5. Expelled student will not be admitted in any other Institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion.

# INTERIM GUIDELINES ON ASSESSMENT METHOD FOR GRANTING ADMISSION IN MBBS COURSE TO PWBD CANDIDATES FOR AY 2025–26

#### PREAMBLE:

In pursuit of equitable and inclusive medical education, the National Medical Commission (NMC) remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring fair access to medical courses for all eligible candidates, including Persons with Disabilities (PwD). In alignment with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, this interim report outlines the foundational framework and preparatory measures for facilitating the admission of PwBD candidates in MBBS Course.

This report serves as a step towards strengthening existing mechanisms, identifying challenges, and proposing recommendations for creating an enabling environment that upholds the principles of dignity, non-discrimination, and equal opportunity. It focuses on key aspects such as assessment of disability, eligibility criteria, reasonable accommodations, accessibility standards, and institutional readiness.

The NMC acknowledges the valuable contribution of a diverse medical workforce and envisions a system where every aspiring student, irrespective of physical or cognitive ability, is empowered to pursue a career in medicine and serve society with competence and compassion.

#### 1. Introduction

In alignment with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016, and subsequent notifications, particularly the directive issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE) on 12.03.2024, which underscores the principles of inclusive education and reasonable accommodation, and the landmark judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 25.10.2024 in Om Rathod vs Union of India & Others (SLP (C) No. 21942 of 2024), a significant shift has been initiated in the national approach toward disability inclusion in higher education.

### 2. Functional Competency Approach

These legal and policy developments collectively emphasize the prioritization of functional competency over rigid percentage-based disability thresholds. In response, the National Medical Commission (NMC) has undertaken proactive measures to ease challenges faced by PwBD candidates, ensuring a fair and inclusive medical education environment. This includes facilitating reasonable accommodations, revisiting eligibility norms, and adopting evaluation criteria focused on individual capabilities.

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# 3. Deliberations and Guideline Development

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Extensive deliberations were held in various meetings of the NMC, engaging a committee of medical experts. A consensus emerged to develop a **comprehensive guideline** focused on functional ability and reasonable accommodation to enable the fair inclusion of PwBD candidates in the **MBBS program**, without subjecting them to undue hardship or exclusion.

This initiative is aimed at reinforcing existing systems, identifying practical challenges, and formulating evidence-based recommendations to build an enabling environment grounded in the principles of dignity, non-discrimination, and equal opportunity. It will focus on critical areas including disability assessment, eligibility criteria, and provision of reasonable accommodations, accessibility standards, and institutional preparedness

# 4. Interim Admission Approach for AY 2025-26

Defining essential competencies for each type of disability involves a very complex process which is multi-dimensional & dynamic. Assistive devices & medical technologies are also rapidly advancing & evolving. Striking a balance between inclusion and the imperatives of patient safety and clinical competence in medical education and practice is of paramount importance.

Pertinent to mention that Post Graduate medical courses shall require specialty specific deliberations, as the required competencies and skills may vary over a wider range and therefore additional consultations with medical experts/ beneficiaries/ stakeholders are needed.

In view of aforesaid facts, final guidelines after following all procedural aspects and further consultations, shall be notified & implemented from subsequent Academic Years. However, the admission process for PwBD candidates for AY 2025–26 must continue uninterrupted. Accordingly, the group of medical experts under the committee duly constituted by NMC (under the chairmanship of Dr. Achal Gulati), have unanimously reached to a conclusion to adopt interim guidelines for admissions in AY 2025–26.

### 5. Functional Assessment of Disabilities

The previously mandated arithmetic **threshold** shall be no longer applicable. Instead, emphasis will be placed on assessing a candidate's **functional ability** to meet the academic and clinical demands of the MBBS course.

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### 6. Mandatory Use of UDID Portal

As per Gazette Notification S.O. 1736(E) dated 05.05.2021, issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), all disability certificates and UDID cards must be issued via the UDID online portal, effective June 1, 2021.

Accordingly, the UDID card has been established as a mandatory document for persons with disabilities. In this context, it may be regarded as an essential and authoritative proof for evaluating the eligibility of meritorious NEET UG candidates under the disability category...

## 7. Evaluation Framework Based on MoSJE Guidelines

Further in view of the paramount importance of patient safety and clinical competence, the assessment of candidates with disabilities may be conducted in accordance with the recently notified guidelines dated 12.03.2024 issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE). These guidelines provide a structured and uniform framework to ensure that the evaluation of disability is both comprehensive and consistent with the responsibilities inherent to medical practice.

## 8. Institutional Responsibilities under the RPwD Act

The medical colleges as per the recommendations prescribed under RPwD Act, 2016, shall make maximum efforts in accommodating and facilitating the candidates with disabilities:

## Non-Discrimination in Admission and Education (Section 16):

Institutions must ensure that no student with a disability is denied admission on the grounds of disability and must provide an inclusive education system at all levels.

## • Infrastructure Accessibility (Section 45):

Institutions must ensure barrier-free access to buildings, classrooms, libraries, laboratories, hostels, and other facilities as per the standards notified by the Government of India.

# Sensitization and Capacity Building:

Colleges are encouraged to conduct awareness and sensitization programs for faculty, staff, and students to promote an inclusive environment and reduce attitudinal barriers.

## Nodal Officer for Disability Affairs:

Institutions are advised to appoint a dedicated Nodal Officer or establish a Disability Cell to address the concerns and support needs of students with disabilities.

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#### Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

An accessible and responsive grievance redressal system must be in place to address complaints related to discrimination or lack of accommodation.

#### 9. Decision Taken

The expert panel unanimously agreed on the following for MBBS admissions under the PwBD category for AY 2025-26:

- PwBD candidates must submit:
  - A valid UDID card issued by a designated medical authority under MoSJE.
  - o Self-Certified affidavits in the format provided under Schedule -I.
  - The candidate will have to approach the designated medical board for verification of their self-certified affidavit.
- Designated Medical Boards (16 designated medical boards) are required to undertake following duties:
  - The competencies mentioned in the appendix under Schedule-I are basic & mandatory. The candidates, to the satisfaction of the designated medical board, may demonstrate the competencies that have been declared by him/her. If the board finds the declared competencies unsubstantiated based on the candidate's performance, it must issue a reasoned decision declaring him/her ineligible to pursue medical course.
  - o If the candidate while self-declaring the essential competencies mentions one or more competencies in negative or is not able to demonstrate one or more of the listed essential competencies, the board shall see if he/she is able to compensate such deficits, by other alternative functionalities; and may take a holistic view regarding his capability to pursue MBBS course.
  - The designated medical boards may utilize standardized tests and tools to evaluate the abilities of the candidates, as per their declaration, instead of focusing on the disabilities.
  - All decisions of the designated medical board(s) shall be in the form speaking orders.

Admissions will be processed by the counseling authority, based on NEET 2025 scores, institutional preferences, and verification of required documents by the concerned designated medical board(s). Medical colleges will provide accommodations accordingly.

### **NOTIFICATION**

In supersession of all previous notifications issued in this regard, the Governor, Himachal Pradesh is pleased to notify PG/Super Speciality Policy for regulating admissions to various Post Graduation and Super Specialty courses in Medical Education applicable in the State of Himachal Pradesh as under: -

- 1. Short Title: This policy may be called the 'Policy for regulating admissions to various Post Graduation and Super Specialty courses in Medical Education applicable in the State of Himachal Pradesh' in short 'PG/SS Policy 2025'.
- 2. Commencement: The policy shall come into effect from the date of notification.
- 3. Definition: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary:
  - **3.1.1 'AMRU-HP'** in short AMRU shall mean the Atal Medical & Research University, Nerchowk, District Mandi, Himachal Pradesh.
  - **3.1.2 'Direct candidate'** shall mean the doctor who is not claiming service benefits/ incentive benefit for pursuing Post Graduation in the State through NEET-PG and shall include candidates of State Quota (Non-GDOs)/ All India Quota.
  - **3.1.3** 'Director, Dental Health Services' in short DDHS shall mean the Director, Dental Health Services, Himachal Pradesh.
  - **3.1.4 'Director, Health Services'** in short DHS shall mean the Director, Health Services, Himachal Pradesh.'
  - **3.1.5** 'Director, Medical Education & Research' in short DME shall mean the Director. Medical Education & Research, Himachal Pradesh.
  - 3.1.6 'Field posting' shall mean the posting in various peripheral Health Institutions of the State including Primary Health Centre, Community Health Centre, Civil Hospitals, District Hospitals, Zonal Hospitals, Regional Hospitals and AIMSS Chamiana (Shimla). Teaching posts in Government Medical/ Dental Colleges/ State Medical Institution of the State shall be excluded from the definition of field posting except AIMSS Chamiana.
  - **3.1.7 'General Duty Officer'** in short GDO shall be those in-service regular doctors under the establishment of DHS, HP.
  - 3.1.8 'Government' shall mean the Government of Himachal Pradesh.



- 3.1.9 'Incentive Certificate' shall mean the certificate issued as per Annexure-B and countersigned by the DHS-HP which shall certify the actual period served by the GDO in a particular field posting and shall be required for calculation of incentive for serving in field postings for the purpose of drawing up of State Quota Merit list.
- 3.1.10 'Institute of National Importance (INI)' shall mean all AIIMS, PGIMER Chandigarh and JIPMER Puducherry and SCTIMST Trivandrum and NIMHANS Bengaluru to which admissions in Post Graduation are made on the basis of separate entrance examination i.e. INI-CET.
- **3.1.11 'Medical faculty'** shall mean regular Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor/ Lecturer under the establishment of Medical Education Department, HP in the various Government Medical/ Dental Colleges of the State.
- **3.1.12 'No Objection Certificate'** in short NOC shall mean the No Objection Certificate issued by the Director, Health Services, Himachal Pradesh to pursue Post Graduation and Super Speciality course as may be applicable.
- **3.1.13 'Post Graduation'** shall mean the Post Graduate MD/ MS/ MDS/ MHA/ MPH/ DNB/ Diploma courses or any such equivalent courses recognized by NMC.
- **3.1.14 'Sponsorship'** shall mean the payment of emoluments/ pay/ allowances along with due increments (if applicable) during the prescribed duration of the course of Post Graduation/ Super Specialty Courses being pursued by the GDO. For all purposes, in case of a sponsored GDO, his/ her Post Graduation/ Super specialty duration shall be considered on-duty. However, in case a GDO is sponsored, he/she shall not be entitled for drawing stipend during the course.
- **3.1.15 'Sponsorship Certificate'** shall mean the certificate issued by the DHS after fulfilment of all the terms and conditions prescribed in this policy as well as bond formalities.
- 3.1.16 'State' shall mean the State of Himachal Pradesh.
- **3.1.17 'State Quota'** shall include the seats which are filled up through State counselling and shall include the unfilled seats of All India Quota which have been reverted to the State.
- **3.1.18 'Super Specialty courses'** shall mean the courses pursued after Post Graduation and shall include DM/ MCh/ DNB (Super Specialty) or any such equivalent courses recognised by NMC.
- 4. (A) Prescribed Ratio for in-service GDOs and direct candidates: -

The Prescribed Ratio for in Service GDO candidates and direct candidates in the State Quota for PG Degree seats in Government Medical and Dental Colleges would be 66.66% - 33.33% respectively and shall be applicable as under:-

- 1) Prescribed distribution of PG (MD/MS) and PG (MDS) courses seats amongst two categories of candidates i.e. in-Service GDO candidates & Direct candidates out of total available seats under 50% State Quota would be as under: -
  - (i) In-service GDO candidates: 66.66%
  - (ii) Direct candidates: 33.33%
- 2) In order to ensure that in-service candidates are admitted to the extent prescribed for them (66.66% out of 50% State Quota) in various PG courses in the medical and dental colleges of the State, the granting of incentive marks to such candidates as per Annexure-A of this policy shall be carried out. Further separate merit list will be drawn in respect of in-service GDO candidates & direct candidates for allocation of 50% State quota Seats in order of merit.
- 3) The admissions to PG courses shall continue to be made upon the marks obtained by candidates in the NEET-PG/ NEET-MDS provided further that inter se merit in respect of In-service GDO candidates shall be drawn after awarding incentive marks for their prescribed seats of 66.6% of 50% State Quota. For direct candidates inter-se merit shall be drawn based upon their marks obtained in the NEET-PG/ NEET-MDS for making admissions to the PG courses under 33.3% seats of the 50% State Quota.
- 4) Further reservation roster in both categories i.e. in-service GDO candidates and direct candidates would also apply for allocation of seats in respect of PG (MD/MS) and PG (MDS) courses.
- 4. (B) GDO Encadrement: The cadre of GDOs shall be built up by the following two methods: -

### 4.1 For Contractual candidates:

On being appointed as regular GDO through any mode of recruitment as prescribed and notified by the Government of Himachal Pradesh from time to time. Provided that those contractual appointees who have been appointed on or before issuance of Department of Personnel, Government of Himachal Pradesh, Notification No. PER(AP)-C-B(15)-3/2024 dated 19.07.2025 and as amended/ notified, shall continue to avail the benefit of this policy.

### 4.2 Regular basis:

- **4.2.1** The contractual GDOs may be regularized in accordance with the policy notified by the Government from time to time.
- **4.2.2** The recruitment may also be conducted through Himachal Pradesh Public Service Commission, Shimla or any mode of recruitment as decided by the State Government from time to time, as the case may be.
- 5. Incentive/NOC/sponsorship for pursuing Post Graduation:
  - 5.1 Incentive for pursuing Post Graduation within the State through NEET-PG:

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- **5.1.1** There shall be no requirement for a NOC to appear in NEET-PG for any of the GDO candidates.
- 5.1.2 The criteria for availing incentive certificate shall be governed as per Clause 5.1.4 and incentive certificate shall be issued to only those GDO who have fulfilled conditions for incentives on the date of declaration of result of NEET-PG.
- 5.1.3 The application for issuance of Incentive Certificate shall be made by the desirous GDO to the concerned authority as per **Annexure-B** under whose establishment he/ she is currently serving. The application shall be made on a prescribed format which shall be notified by the **AMRU**, **Mandi**. The concerned authority as per **Annexure-B** shall verify the service particulars of the GDO concerned from the maintained service record and send the Incentive Certificate for counter signature of the DHS.
- **5.1.4 Eligibility Criteria:** The categorization of medical blocks/ health institutions under various tribal/ remote/ hard/ difficult/ rural areas of the State with area wise incentives and prior mandatory services required for admissions to the PG courses/ degrees for in-service GDOs through NEET-PG within the State shall be as under:
  - i) In case a Medical Officer has served in more than one category of area, the mandatory service period will be calculated on pro-rata basis as the case may be.
  - ii) The GDO shall be entitled for incentive in terms of percentage of marks obtained in NEET-PG based on their services rendered in various field postings as per **Annexure-A** of this policy. This incentive will be subject to maximum of 30%. The percentage incentive shall be computed on prorata basis for the actual duration of service rendered in a particular field posting as per the following formula:-

In case, a particular GDO has been posted at one particular station but he is deputed for some period to another station, the actual duration served at a particular field posting will be taken into account for the calculation of incentive. This incentive shall be available to only those GDOs who are in the active service of the State in a continuous manner and for the purpose of computing the incentive, the present continuous service shall be taken into account; meaning thereby, any doctor who has served as a GDOs in the past but has subsequently resigned from GDOship shall not be eligible to avail benefit of this incentive on the basis of any previous service. Similarly, if he/ she subsequently joins GDOship again, the incentive will be calculated taking into consideration the latest period of service reckoned as GDO from the date when he/she is in continuous service without any break.

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- **iii)** That as per **Annexure-A** of this policy no incentive will be given for service in urban areas and the mandatory period for service in these areas shall be four years.
- iv) Further as per Annexure-A of this policy prescribed mandatory services under various categorized areas of the State will qualify for admissions to PG (MD/MS) and PG(MDS) courses through NEET-PG within the State and period beyond prescribed mandatory services shall be counted for incentives for the purpose of this policy.
- v) That as per Annexure-A of this Policy all the areas other than (i) Tribal/Remotest areas (ii) Hard/Difficult Areas (iii) Difficult Rural Areas and (iv) Urban Areas which are not covered under Category A, B & C of Annexure-A and are not Urban Areas are "All other Rural Areas of HP".
- vi) That the "Urban Areas of HP" for the purpose of implementation of this policy includes those areas which are notified as Municipal Corporation constituted under the Himachal Pradesh Municipal Corporation Act, 1994 (12 of 1994) or a Municipal Council or a Nagar Panchayat constituted under the Himachal Pradesh Municipal Act, 1994 (13 of 1994) or the Cantonment Board and the Special areas as designated under the H.P. TCP Act (1977) other than in Tribal/Remotest Areas, Hard/ Difficult Areas and Difficult Rural Areas as per Annexure-A.
- vii) That the incentive certificate and certificate for prior mandatory service period before availing incentives shall be as per Annexure-B and Annexure-C.
- **5.1.5** For the purpose of computation of incentive by the DHS, the cut off date shall be the date of declaration of NEET-PG result.
- **5.1.6** The date schedule for issuance of such **Incentive Certificate** shall be notified by the **AMRU**, Mandi either as a part of Prospectus or separately.
- 5.1.7 No application for issuance of **Incentive Certificate** shall be entertained after the expiry of period mentioned in notification as per **Clause 5.1.6**. If any GDO fails to make application before the expiry the last date prescribed for the purpose it shall be presumed that he/ she is not interested in availing the benefit of the incentive.
- 5.1.8 The incentive applicable for each field posting for a particular candidate shall be calculated, summed up and rounded off to three decimal points by the DHS. The DHS shall compile the list of all candidates who have applied for issuance of Incentive Certificate alongwith their **NEET-PG** roll number and communicate the entitled incentive (till three decimal points) in respect of each candidate to the **AMRU**, **Mandi** for drawing up a combined merit list in respect of GDO and direct candidates. The individual original Incentive Certificate shall be filed in the personal record of the GDO.
- **5.1.9** No incentive shall be applicable for those GDOs who are appearing for the All India counselling.

### 5.2 NOC/ Sponsorship for pursuing Post Graduation against sponsored quota seats of <u>Institutes of National Importance (INI):</u>

- 5.2.1 The NOC shall be issued only to GDOs desirous of pursuing Post Graduation from the Institutes of National Importance (INI) for appearing in their entrance examination against the sponsored quota of the Institutes of National Importance (INI) subject to the following conditions:-
  - (i) The GDO should be regular and should have three years of uninterrupted continuous services without any break or unauthorized absence. For the computation of three years services the cutoff date shall be one day before the date of the commencement of the course. His/ her service record to this effect should have been verified by the concerned Chief Medical Officer as per maintained service record. Such verification shall be obtained by the concerned GDO from the concerned Chief Medical Officer/ Principal before making application to the DHS for NOC for appearing in examination.
  - (ii) The NOC will not be given before three years of service as required at Clause 5.2.1 (i) notwithstanding the requirement of lesser service in the prospectus of any particular autonomous institution.
- 5.3 Such candidates who have been granted NOC/ Sponsorship for appearing in the entrance examination of Institutes of National Importance (INI) subject to conditions as laid down at Clause 5.2.1 and are subsequently selected in the institutions shall apply to the DHS for relieving along with the result card. The DHS shall then complete all the formalities as prescribed in Clause 6 and shall relieve the candidate only after furnishing of bond documents.

### 5.4 Sponsorship:

5.4.1 After the counseling, the GDOs regular desirous of pursuing Post Graduation within or outside the State shall apply for sponsorship to the DHS. The prerequisites for issuance of sponsorship certificate shall be the following:

### 5.4.1.1 For Post Graduation within the State:-

- (a) The candidate should have applied and should have been issued Incentive Certificate as per the provisions of this policy.
- (b) Fulfillment of all formalities as per Clause-6.
- (c) The GDO candidates desirous of doing PG in Government Medical/ Dental Colleges of the State through All India Quota (AIQ) shall apply to the DHS for NOC/ Sponsorship.

### 5.4.1.2 For Post Graduation outside the State through NEET-PG/ Unsponsored quota of Institutes of National Importance:

- (a) No GDO shall be sponsored for Post Graduation outside the State through NEET-PG or against non-sponsored quota of Institutes of National Importance (INI).
- (b) Such GDOs who secure admissions in Post Graduation courses outside the State through NEET-PG or against unsponsored quota

- of Institutes of National Importance (INI)\_may avail leave of kind due including Study Leave/ Extra Ordinary Leave, as may be otherwise admissible as per CCS (Leave) Rules.
- (c) Such GDOs who secure admissions in Post Graduation courses outside the State through NEET-PG or against unsponsored quota of Institutes of National Importance (INI) shall apply to the DHS for relieving. If the candidate has sufficient leave of kind due as per Clause (b) above, the same may be recommended to the Government subject to the conditions as per the leave being granted including bond period for Study Leave. If sufficient leave is not admissible as may be required for duration of the Post Graduation course, the GDO will have to resign if he/ she wants to pursue the Post Graduation and accordingly his/ her case shall be sent to the Government by the DHS alongwith recommendations.
- 5.5 If any GDO joins Post Graduation within or outside the state through NEET-PG exam/ Institutes of National Importance (INI) Entrance Examination as a direct candidate without due resignation/ permission, in case of contractual GDO his/ her services shall be deemed terminated and recovery shall be made as per terms of contract agreement and in case of regular GDO candidate, disciplinary proceedings shall be initiated besides writing to the concerned Head of Institute for cancellation of the admission.

### 6. Terms and conditions of Bond for Post Graduation:

6.1 As the Government incurs substantive expenditure on each candidate for doing Post Graduation and also pays them full pay along with all allowances and seniority during the course, every GDO (regular/contract) who have been sponsored to pursue Post Graduation within the State in Government Medical/ Dental colleges shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least four years including mandatory one vear of field posting after completion of their respective courses. Similarly, in case of GDOs sponsored for Post Graduation outside the State on sponsored quota seats of Institutes of National Importance (INI), as the Government pays them full pay along with increments during the course and they are not even serving the state during the course, every such GDO (regular) shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least five years including mandatory one year of field posting after completion of their respective courses. Since the direct candidate who pursues Post Graduation within the State in Government Medical/ Dental Colleges on State/ All India Quota stand on a different footing as they are not entitled to service benefits including full pay (with allowances and increments) and chances of regularization to which their GDO counterparts are entitled; however, keeping in view the resources expended in their education by the government including payment of stipend, every such direct candidate shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least two years including mandatory one year of field posting after completion of their respective courses.

Further, on selection for Senior Residency/ Tutorship by the GDO/ direct candidates from the Government Medical Colleges/ Institutes of the State during the mandatory bond period would lead to extension of the present bond period of the concerned GDO/ direct candidates to serve the State till completion of three years of Senior Residency/ Tutorship as the case may be. Provided further that field posting shall be exempted for those candidates

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joining at AIMSS Chamiana (Shimla) after completion on their respective PG courses/ degree and the respective period of 01 (one) year of their service at AIMSS Chamiana (Shimla) shall be counted as 'mandatory field posting' under the provisions of this policy.

Provided further that such GDOs who get selected as per Clause 6.5, for doing Super Speciality before completion of the bond period of Post Graduation as such in that event the candidate already being bonded to serve the State as per the provisions of this policy for doing Post Graduation for 4/5 years alongwith bond amount of Rs. 40 Lakhs on such selection for the Superspecialty course will have to furnish an undertaking on judicial paper to serve the balance/remaining bond period for doing Post Graduation alongwith the bond period applicable after doing Super Speciality course for serving the State as the case may be. For this purpose both the bond periods shall be clubbed together for serving the State for a period equal to balance/remaining bond period of PG course + mandatory period of bond in respect of Superspecialty course apart from the mandatory one year of field posting and the candidates shall furnish a fresh bond in the form of legal undertaking to serve the State for the clubbed period failing which the candidate shall have to pay Rs. 90 Lakhs to the State Government. The candidate shall also furnish an undated cheque from a scheduled bank amounting to Rs. 90 Lakhs in the name of DHS/ DME. The DHS/ DME shall be at liberty to get the cheque encashed in event of violation of the bond conditions.

### 6.2 The bond as per Clause 6.1 shall be in the following form:

- 6.2.1 The Bond shall be non-transferable to Medical Institutes (not owned by the State Government)/ Institutes of National Importance (INI) functioning within/ outside the State for all intents and purposes. All the candidates as per Clause 6.1 shall furnish a bond in the form of a legal undertaking to serve the State for prescribed period which should be attested by competent authority not below the rank of Executive magistrate failing which the candidate shall have to pay the Rs. 40 Lakhs and in case of clubbed bond period Rs. 90 Lakhs as the case may be to the State Government. The candidate shall also furnish an undated cheque from a scheduled bank amounting to Rs. 40/90 Lakhs in the name of DHS. The DHS shall be at liberty to get the cheque encashed in event of violation of the bond conditions.
- 6.2.2 The candidates as per Clause 6.1 shall also deposit their original bachelor degree in case of MD/MS course and MD/MS degree in case of Superspeciality course and registration certificate from the Medical/ Dental Council concerned with the DHS/ DDHS (in case of GDOs) and the Principal concerned (in case of direct candidates). The concerned issuing University/ Institution shall be informed about such retention and the candidate shall be debarred from obtaining any duplicate degree. The original bachelor degree shall be released only after completion of the Bond Period including one year mandatory field posting or after deposition of the requisite amount and this shall be a part of the bond agreement.
- 6.2.3 The candidates shall also furnish undertaking as a part of bond that they shall complete the course prescribed failing which they shall be liable to pay Rs.
  10 Lakhs + 18% interest per annum and salary/ stipend drawn as the case may be to the State government for wastage of seat.

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- **6.2.4** The prescribed format of the bond shall be as per **Annexure D**.
- 6.3 It shall be the sole responsibility of DHS/ DDHS to ensure the furnishing of such documents from each GDO candidate who is being sponsored and the sole responsibility of the Principal of concerned Government Medical/ Dental College to ensure collection of these documents at the time of admission of a direct candidate to the course. Any dereliction of duty in this end shall make the concerned liable for action.
- The custodian of these three documents— (i) Bond as legal undertaking, (ii) Undated Cheque and (iii) the original Bachelor's degree shall be DHS/ DDHS (in case of GDOs) and concerned Principal of Government Medical/ Dental Colleges (in case of direct candidates). Two months before the tentative completion of the Post Graduation in every Government Medical/ Dental College, the DHS/ DDHS shall take list of candidates through concerned Principals who are bonded to serve the state. Simultaneously, the DHS/ DDHS shall take over the custody of the documents including the Bond agreement, Undated Cheque and Original Bachelor degree in respect of direct candidates. The field posting orders of such candidates shall be issued by the DHS/ DDHS as early as possible on successful completion of PG course by the concerned candidates as per the NMC norms and submission of joining report to be submitted to the DHS/ DDHS. The concerned Principals shall relieve the candidates (including GDOs and Direct candidate) only after successful completion of the course with the direction to report to the DHS.
- 6.5 In no case, NOC will be granted for second Post Graduation course to any candidate during the mandatory period of service of the State including field posting after first Post Graduation except for doing Superspeciality course.
- 6.6 The following shall constitute a violation of the bond to serve the state as outlined in Clause 6.1:
  - 6.6.1 Failure to join the DHS/ DDHS within 10 days on successful completion of PG course as per NMC norms and once the posting orders are issued, the concerned shall be regulated as per instructions/ guidelines/ policy of the Department of Personnel, Government of Himachal Pradesh.
  - **6.6.2** Putting in request for EOL/ Study leave/ NOC during the mandatory period of service of the State.
- 6.7 In the event of a candidate violating the terms of bond as outlined in Clause 6.6, the following actions shall be initiated by the DHS:
  - **6.7.1** The salary paid to the GDOs (sponsored) and stipend paid to the direct candidates shall be recovered through due process of law alongwith bond amount and 18% interest per annum.
  - **6.7.2** The bond amount shall be recovered through due process of law. The Undated Cheque submitted by the candidate as a part of bond documents shall be en-cashed.
  - **6.7.3** Initiation of disciplinary proceedings against the GDO candidate.
  - **6.7.4** The original bachelor degree shall not be returned and endorsement shall be made to the concerned University thereof.

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**6.7.5** Cancellation of registration from the concerned Medical/ Dental Council.

### 7. Remuneration during Post Graduation:

- 7.1 The GDOs appointed on contract basis and sponsored for pursuing Post Graduation within the State as per Clause 5.3 shall be paid the emoluments as fixed by the Government of HP and the same shall also be part of the Bond agreement also.
- 7.2 The Regular GDOs sponsored for pursuing Post Graduation within the State and outside the State on sponsored quota seats of Institutes of National Importance (INI) as per Clause 5.3 shall be treated on duty during the prescribed period of Post Graduation and he/ she shall be paid the regular pay, allowances including increments for such prescribed period. In case, the sponsored GDO is not able to complete the Post Graduation within the prescribed time period, the extra period spent during Post Graduation beyond the prescribed period may be regularized against the leave of kind due. If there is no sufficient leave of kind due in his/ her credit, that period shall be treated as EOL and the payment made to the person for this period shall be recovered from the candidates.
- 7.3 Direct candidates shall be paid stipend as applicable to them.

### 8 Remuneration during the mandatory field posting:

- 8.1 The regular GDO shall continue to draw the emoluments and pay admissible to him/ her with due allowances and increments during the period of mandatory field posting.
- **8.2** The contractual GDO shall continue to draw the salary as admissible to him as per terms of the contract.
- 8.3 The Direct candidates shall draw salary at the rate as fixed by the Government and shall be treated as contractual GDOs for all practical purposes during the period of mandatory field posting. However, if the direct candidate subsequently joins as Senior Resident in any of the Medical Colleges after completion of mandatory period of field posting, he shall draw the stipend as prescribed for a Senior Resident as notified by the Government from time to time.

### 9 Terms for leaving Post Graduation course midway:

- 9.1 If the GDO's who have been granted sponsorship for pursuing Post Graduation within the State or outside the State, leaves the Post Graduation course midway, he/she shall be debarred to re-appear in any entrance examination for Post Graduation for the next five years within and outside the State of Himachal Pradesh. The period of five years for the purpose of de-barring shall be reckoned from the date of leaving the course midway.
- 9.2 In addition to this, for those GDO's who leave Post Graduation course mid way, the period spent in the Medical Colleges during Post Graduation may be regularized against the leave of kind due. If there is no sufficient leave of kind due in his credit that period may be treated as EOL and the payment made to the person for this period shall be recovered from the candidates. In addition to this, the GDO shall have to pay Rs. 10 Lakhs + interest @18% per annum alongwith salary drawn in event of leaving the course midway as per terms of the bond. However, such GDOs shall be exempted from payment of Rs. 10 Lakhs for justified reasons within 90 days of commencement of the said course.

9.3 In case of direct candidates who leave the course midway, they shall have to pay Rs.

10 Lakh + interest @18% per annum alongwith stipend drawn to the State Government as per the terms and conditions of the bond. Information in respect of such cases shall be sent to the DHS by the concerned Principal along with bond and other documents.

### 10 The terms for second Post Graduation Course:

The GDOs who have been sponsored to pursue Post Graduation within or outside the State earlier and who are desirous of pursuing a second Post Graduation Course shall be governed by the following conditions:

- 10.1 The GDOs who have completed PG Degree in one specialty shall not be granted sponsorship/ NOC for pursuing PG Degree in any other specialty. However, such candidates may pursue their second PG degree course only after the grant of EOL by the Government as per CCS Leave Rules.
- 10.2 The GDOs who have completed PG Diploma/ DNB in one specialty may be given NOC for pursuing PG Degree in the same specialty, only after serving the state for at least five years (either in field postings or in Government Medical/ Dental Colleges) after completion of PG Diploma/ DNB.
- 10.3 The GDOs who have completed PG Diploma/ DNB in one specialty shall not be granted NOC for pursuing PG Degree/ DNB/ Diploma in any other specialty. However, such candidates may pursue their second PG degree course only after the grant of EOL by the Government as per CCS (Leave) Rules.
- 10.4 Any GDO who is not fulfilling the condition of minimum required service to be sponsored as Post Graduate Candidate within or out of the State shall have to resign on their selection against direct/ open seats before joining such courses. And if he/ she joins Post Graduation without getting NOC from the Government or without submitting his/ her resignation, in case of contractual GDO his/ her services shall be deemed terminated and recovery shall be made as per terms of contract agreement and in case of regular GDO candidate, disciplinary proceedings shall be initiated besides writing to the concerned Head of Institute for cancellation of the admission.

### 11 NOC and Sponsorship for pursuing Super Specialty Courses:

### 11.1 NOC/ Sponsorship for GDOs:

- 11.1.1 There shall be no requirement of NOC for appearing in the All India NEET-Super Specialty or any other Entrance Examination to the Super specialty courses prescribed except for appearing against the Sponsored quota seats of the Institutes of National Importance (INI).
- 11.1.2 Since the State needs the services of Super Specialists to improve the health care facilities within the State, the State would offer Sponsorship to candidates who wish to pursue Super Specialty courses, subject to following conditions:
  - a) The GDO seeking Sponsorship should be regular and should have completed the mandatory service of the State after Post Graduation as per Clause 6.1 if the candidate had pursued Post Graduation earlier as a sponsored candidate.

- b) Those candidates who had initially joined as Direct Candidates but subsequently turned GDO or those who have joined GDOship after doing Post Graduation from elsewhere shall be considered for Sponsorship to Super Speciality courses subject to the conditions that the GDO should be regular and should have served the State for at least three years including one year mandatory field posting.
- c) In case of GDOs, who fulfill the conditions as laid down in clause (a) and (b) above, and have cleared NEET-SS or any such prescribed examination including unsponsored seats of Institutes of National Importance (INI) shall apply to the DHS for Sponsorship and shall be relieved after fulfillment of formalities as prescribed at Clause 11.3.
- d) In case of GDOs, who wish to pursue the Super Specialty courses on sponsored seats of Institutes of National Importance (INI), the NOC shall be granted only subject to fulfillment of Clause 11.1.2 (a) and (b) above, notwithstanding the requirement of lesser/ greater service in the prospectus of any particular Institutes of National Importance (INI).
- e) Such candidates who have been granted NOC as prescribed at Clause (d) above and have been subsequently selected to pursue the Super Specialty course against sponsored quota of Institute of National Importance (INI) shall apply to the DHS for relieving and shall be relieved after fulfillment of formalities as prescribed at Clause 11.3 below.
- 11.1.3 There shall be no annual capping on the number of sponsored seats for Super Specialty courses.
- 11.1.4 Any GDO who is not fulfilling the condition of minimum required service to be sponsored as Super Specialty Candidate within or out of the State shall have to resign and complete the obligation of the bond on their selection against direct/ open seats before joining such courses. And if he/ she joins Super Specialty course without getting NOC/ Sponsorship from the Government or without submitting his/ her resignation, in case of contractual GDO his/ her services shall be deemed terminated and recovery shall be made as per terms of contract agreement and in case of regular GDO candidate, disciplinary proceedings shall be initiated besides writing to the concerned Head of Institute for cancellation of the admission.

### 11.2 NOC/ Sponsorship for Faculty Members of Government Medical Colleges/ Institutions:

- 11.2.1 The State shall also allow the regular faculty members to pursue Super Specialty courses for career progression and providing better services to the patients of the State. However sponsorship shall only be available for the sponsored quota seats of Super Specialty courses in Institutes of National Importance (INI):
- 11.2.2 The conditions of sponsorship for faculty members shall be the following:
  - a) The faculty member should be regular.

- b) He/ she should have served for a minimum period of three years in Government Medical College/ institution as Assistant Professor or above.
- e) He/ she should be occupying a post which is over and above the NMC requirement for running of Under Graduate/ Post Graduate courses in the concerned institutions. For instance if as per NMC requirement two posts of Assistant Professors are required in Department of Medicine in a particular institutions and the candidates who is seeking Sponsorship is one amongst the only two Assistant Professors available, he/ she will not be given the benefit of the Sponsorship in any case. However, if there are three or more Assistant Professors working against the sanctioned strength, which is more than the NMC requirement, Sponsorship may be granted on a first come first serve basis.
- 11.2.3 The DME shall be competent to sign the Sponsorship certificate on the behalf of the Government subject to fulfillment of conditions as outlined at Clause 11.2.2 above and Clause 11.3 below.
- In the event of selection of the applicant who has been issued Sponsorship certificate, the post which the incumbent was occupying before leaving for the course shall remain vacant and the incumbent shall join back on the same post after completion of Super Specialty course. The medical faculty candidate who has successfully completed the course and joined back the Medical Education Department shall be entitled for seniority of the prescribed duration of the course in the same department. However, any formal designation/ promotion shall happen only once the candidate joins back. In case, the incumbent wants to join against available entry level vacancy in the Super Specialty Department, he/ she shall be allowed to join. However, in no case shall the incumbent be allowed to occupy the higher post in the Super Specialty Department and his services in that Department shall be counted from the date of actual joining for the purpose of seniority/ promotion etc.
- 11.2.5 In case any candidate of the regular medical faculty wants to appear for/pursue Super Specialty through NEET-Super specialty examination or the unsponsored quota seats of Institutes of National Importance (INI), he/ she may avail leave of kind due including Study leave. However, in case sufficient leave is not admissible, the candidate will have to resign from the post and the post shall be deemed vacant for all purposes. And if he/she joins Super Specialty course without getting NOC/ sponsorship from the Government or without submitting his/ her resignation, disciplinary proceedings shall be initiated besides writing to the concerned Head of Institute for cancellation of the admission.

### 11.3 Terms and Conditions of Sponsorship for Super Specialty Courses:

11.3.1 As the Government incurs substantive expenditure on each candidate for doing Super Specialty course and also pays them full pay during the course, every GDO (regular) who have been sponsored to pursue Post Super Specialty within the State in Government Medical/ Dental Colleges shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least five years after completion of their respective courses. Similarly, in case of GDOs/ Medical

faculty sponsored for Super Specialty course outside the State (including sponsored quota seats of Institutes of National Importance), as the Government pays them full pay alongwith increments during the course, every GDO (regular)/ Medical faculty who has been sponsored to pursue Super Specialty outside the State shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least seven years after completion of their respective courses. Similarly, as the Government expends huge resources in the education of direct candidates including payment of stipend, every direct candidate who pursues Super Specialty within the State in Government Medical/Dental Colleges shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for at least three years after completion of their respective courses.

### 11.3.2 Categories of Super Speciality Students (GDO/ Direct) shall furnish Bond as per detail below:

- a) The candidates shall furnish a bond in the form of a legal undertaking to serve the State for prescribed period failing which the candidate shall have to pay the Rs. 60 Lakhs and in case of clubbed bond period Rs. 90 Lakhs as per Clause 6.1 as the case may be to the State Government. The candidate shall also furnish an Undated Cheque from a scheduled bank amounting to Rs. 60 Lakhs and in case of clubbed bond period Rs. 90 Lakhs as the case may be in the name of DHS (in case of GDOs) and or Principal concerned (in case of medical faculty/ direct candidates). The DHS/ Principal concerned shall be at liberty to get the cheque encashed in event of violation of the bond conditions.
- b) The candidates shall also furnish undertaking as a part of bond that they shall complete the course prescribed failing which they shall be liable to pay Rs. 15 lakhs + 18% interest per annum alongwith salary/stipend drawn during the said period as the case may be to the State government for wastage of seat.
- c) The prescribed format of the bond shall be as per Annexure-D.
- 11.3.3 The general conditions including violation and procedure to be adopted shall be same as outlined in Clause 6 above, unless otherwise prescribed in this Clause. For Super Speciality courses, MBBS degree, MD/MS degree and Undated Cheque (as the case may be) will be deposited in the office of DHS/DME with the intimation to the concerned institution.

### 11.4 For leaving the course midway:

- 11.4.1 The GDOs, who leave the DM/ MCh Super Specialty Course midway either within the State or outside the State of HP, shall stand debarred to re-appear as a sponsored candidate for pursuing DM/ MCh Super Specialty course for next five years, for both within the State and outside the State of Himachal Pradesh. The period of five years for the purpose of de-barring shall be reckoned from the date of leaving the course midway.
- 11.4.2 In case, the GDO who has been sponsored and treated as on duty (with full pay and allowances), leaves the course midway, the period involved shall be converted into/ debited from leave of kind due standing in his credit on the date on which he proceeded to join such course. If there is no sufficient

leave of kind due in his credit that period may be treated as EOL and the payment made to the person for this period shall be recovered from the candidates. In addition to this, the GDO shall have to pay Rs. 15 Lakhs + 18% interest per annum + salary drawn during the said period as the case may be in event of leaving the course midway as per terms of the bond.

- 11.4.3 In case of direct candidates who leave the course midway, they shall have to pay Rs. 15 lakh + 18% interest per annum + stipend drawn to the State Government as per the terms of the bond. Information in respect of such cases shall be sent to the DME by the concerned Principal along with bond documents.
- As per Clause 6.4 of this policy, the Principals while relieving the candidates shall forward the information on the prescribed Proforma to the DHS, as per Annexure-E.
- 13 The State Government reserves the right to alter/ amend any provision in the PG Policy at any time/ from time to time.
