As per students NEET PG 2021 question paper was easy in comparison to the last year. Questions were clinical-based. The maximum weightage of questions was from Obstetrics and Gynecology, and Pharmacology.

About NEET PG 2021

NEET PG 2021 was conducted on Saturday, September 11 in 255 test cities and around 800 centres across the country. Around 2 lakh candidates appeared for the exam. The exam was held in a single shift (from 9 am to 12:30 pm) with extra protective measures amid COVID-19. NEET PG 2021 question paper comprised a total of 200 questions with 800 marks.
