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Detailed Preparation Tips

Build Strong Fundamentals First

For Quantitative Aptitude, focus on Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry fundamentals. For Reasoning, understand common puzzle structures and logical concepts. For English, strengthen grammar, vocabulary and reading comprehension skills.

Prioritize High-Weightage Topics

Give maximum attention to Arithmetic, Data Interpretation, Seating Arrangements, Puzzles, Critical Reasoning, Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary and Grammar.

Improve Calculation Speed

Practice percentage calculations, approximations, squares, cubes and mental math techniques to solve questions faster.

Practice Data Interpretation Regularly

Solve questions based on tables, bar graphs, line graphs and pie charts under timed conditions.

Develop Logical Thinking Skills

Solve reasoning questions daily and maintain notes of recurring reasoning patterns and shortcuts.

Strengthen Reading and Vocabulary

Read newspapers and editorials regularly, learn new words daily and revise vocabulary consistently.

Take Mock Tests Consistently

Attempt sectional and full-length mocks regularly. Analyze mistakes and identify weak areas after every test.

Create a Smart Exam Strategy

Begin with easier questions, prioritize accuracy over attempts and manage time carefully across sections.

Revise Frequently

Maintain separate revision sheets for formulas, vocabulary, grammar rules and reasoning concepts.



Last-Month Preparation Plan

Focus on revision, frequent mocks, error analysis and daily practice. Avoid learning too many new topics close to the exam.
