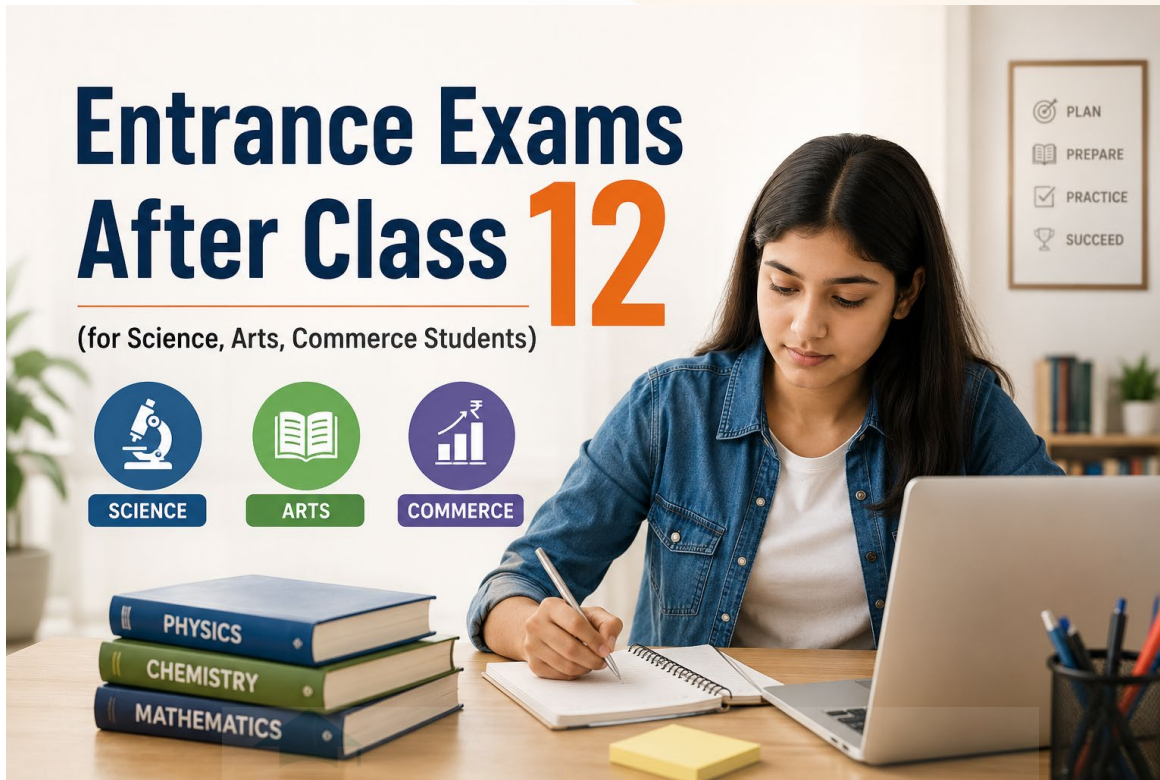

NEET UG

Students aspiring to become doctors, dentists, veterinarians, or pursue AYUSH and other healthcare courses must qualify NEET UG, the national medical entrance examination.

CUET UG
