General Preparation Tips — How to Crack SBI PO 2026

To prepare for the SBI PO exam, candidates must be thorough with the syllabus and exam pattern. Building a structured timetable, improving speed under timed conditions, and practising descriptive writing are essential habits. The eight proven tips below cover the complete preparation strategy for both Prelims and Mains.

1 Revise Previous Years' Question Papers

Focus on the revision of critical topics with maximum weightage in the SBI PO Prelims exam. Previous years' papers reveal the pattern of frequently asked questions and help you prioritise topics that carry higher marks. Attempt at least the last 5 years' papers under timed conditions.

2 Revise with Short Video Tutorials

A large number of video tutorials are available online for bank exam preparation. Short tutorials are highly effective for rapid revision of formulas, grammar rules, and reasoning tricks. Use them in the final 2–3 weeks to consolidate concepts quickly before the exam.

3 Analyse Mock Tests Thoroughly

Take sectional and full-length mock tests regularly throughout your preparation. In the final phase, reduce the number of new mock tests and focus on analysing previous ones deeply. Identify weak areas, track accuracy trends, and work specifically on improving those areas.

4 Be Clear with Core Concepts

The SBI PO syllabus is of graduation level, but basic concepts from Class 10–12 textbooks are sufficient for Quantitative Aptitude and Grammar. Never skip concept clarity — without it, shortcuts will not be reliable and you will make errors under pressure.

5 Learn and Apply Shortcuts

Time management is critical in SBI PO because of sectional timing. Learn shortcuts for simplifications, DI calculations, and grammar rules. Shortcuts help you attempt maximum questions in the least possible time and improve your overall score significantly.

6 Increase Daily Practice

Practice with more sectional tests and attempt at least one full-length mock test every day as the exam approaches. Always practise on a computer to simulate actual exam conditions — this reduces interface-related anxiety on exam day and improves your typing speed for the descriptive test.

7 Avoid Guesswork — Negative Marking Applies

SBI PO has a penalty of $\frac{1}{4}$ mark for every wrong answer in the objective section. Do not guess randomly. Only attempt questions you are reasonably confident about. Unanswered questions carry zero penalty — leaving a question is always safer than a random guess.

8 Attempt Questions Strategically

While attempting the exam, do not get stuck on any single question. If a question is unclear or taking too long, move on and come back later. Be especially careful with puzzle-based and circular arrangement questions in Reasoning — they are time-intensive and need a calm approach.

Section-wise Preparation Plan

Each section of SBI PO demands a distinct preparation strategy. The subject-specific guides below outline what to focus on, what to avoid, and which topics carry the most weight for both Prelims and Mains.

■ SBI PO Preparation for English Language

Questions in the Prelims are easier than in Mains. Brush up on grammar rules and expand your vocabulary by reading English newspapers daily. Focus on Reading Comprehension, Error Spotting, Cloze Tests, Para Jumbles, and Fill-in-the-Blanks. English is one of the highest-scoring sections if prepared consistently — small daily habits over weeks make a significant difference.

■ SBI PO Preparation for Reasoning Ability

The Reasoning section offers strong score-maximisation opportunities. Focus on Symbols, Puzzles (Linear Arrangements, Circular Arrangements, Distribution and Comparison). These question types test a candidate's ability to follow complex instructions under time pressure. Input-Output and Data Sufficiency are primarily Mains topics — but candidates must stay alert as they may appear in Prelims too. Practice timed puzzle sets daily.

■ SBI PO Preparation for Quantitative Aptitude

Pay close attention to Simplifications, Approximations, Missing and Wrong Number Series, Data Interpretation (DI), and Quadratic Comparisons. Questions are very logical and calculation-heavy. Practice DI sets — tables, bar graphs, pie charts, and caselets — daily. Learn Vedic maths or standard shortcuts for speedy calculation. Accuracy matters more than speed in this section.

■ SBI PO Preparation for Computer Aptitude (Mains only)

Focus on computer basics, operating systems fundamentals, input-output devices, LAN and WAN networking concepts, storage devices, and Basic MS Office applications (Word, Excel, PowerPoint). The Computer Aptitude section is clubbed with Reasoning in Mains (60 marks combined). It is largely factual and can be mastered with 2–3 weeks of focused revision.

■ SBI PO Preparation for General / Economy / Banking Awareness

Read national and financial newspapers daily and watch banking & economy news. Focus on Indian Economy, Banking Awareness, RBI guidelines, government schemes, Union Budget, Agriculture, Sports, Awards & Honours, Indian Constitution, and Marketing concepts. Banking terminologies (RTGS, NEFT, REPO rate, CRR, SLR, etc.) are essential and frequently tested. Maintain a monthly current affairs notes file to revise efficiently.

■■ **Descriptive Test Reminder (Mains):** The Mains includes a 30-minute Descriptive Test — Letter Writing and Essay Writing — worth 50 marks. Practise writing 250–300 word essays and formal letters daily. Focus on structure, clarity, grammar, and relevance to current banking topics. This section has NO negative marking.

SBI PO 2026 Exam Pattern

The SBI PO exam consists of three stages: **Prelims, Mains, and Interview**. The Prelims is qualifying in nature (marks not counted in final merit). The Mains marks and Interview together determine the final selection.

■ **Marking Scheme:** +1 mark for every correct answer in the objective test. $-\frac{1}{4}$ mark (negative marking) for every wrong answer in the objective test. No negative marking for the Descriptive Test. No penalty for unattempted/blank questions — leaving a question is always better than guessing.
