

RIE CEE Participating Colleges

A guide to the Regional Institutes of Education (RIEs) that admit students through the Common Entrance Examination (CEE) conducted by NCERT.

Overview

The Regional Institutes of Education (RIEs) are constituent units of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), set up in 1963 to improve school education through quality pre-service and in-service teacher training programmes. Admission to the integrated and postgraduate teacher-education programmes at these institutes is granted on the basis of the Common Entrance Examination (CEE), popularly known as RIE CEE.

There are six RIE institutions across India, each serving a specific region of the country and affiliated to a designated state university. Together they offer roughly 1,200-1,250 seats every year across undergraduate and postgraduate teacher-education programmes.

Note: Regional coverage determines domicile-based eligibility for undergraduate seats at each RIE; postgraduate programmes such as M.Ed. and M.A. Education Technology are generally open to candidates from all states/UTs.

Courses Offered

Each RIE offers a mix of integrated undergraduate and postgraduate teacher-education programmes. The exact set of programmes varies slightly by institute, as summarised below.

Seats and Selection

RIEs together offer roughly 1,200-1,250 seats a year across all programmes, with figures varying annually based on the notification released for that admission cycle. Selection is merit-based, governed by the candidate's RIE CEE rank, seat availability, reservation policy, and marks in the qualifying examination. Admission is finalised through a multi-round counselling process in which candidates confirm their allotted seat, submit documents, and pay admission fees within the prescribed deadlines.

Eligibility Snapshot

- **Integrated UG programmes (B.Sc./B.A. B.Ed.):** Candidates must have passed Class XII (or equivalent) with at least 50% aggregate marks (5% relaxation for SC/ST/PwD candidates).
- **B.Ed. (Secondary):** A relevant Bachelor's/Master's degree with at least 50% marks in Science, Social Science, or Humanities; candidates with a B.E./B.Tech. in Mathematics or Science may also apply.
- **M.Ed.:** A B.Ed. or equivalent professional degree with the prescribed minimum marks.
- **M.A. Education Technology:** A relevant Bachelor's degree meeting the minimum marks criterion; open to candidates from all states and UTs.

About the RIE CEE Exam

The RIE CEE is a national-level, computer-based entrance test conducted by NCERT for admission to teacher-education programmes at the participating RIEs. The exam is organised into three difficulty levels, matched to the programme group being applied for:

- **Level 1:** B.Sc.B.Ed. / B.A.B.Ed. / M.Sc.Ed. (Mysuru) — pitched at the higher-secondary level.
- **Level 2:** B.Ed. / B.Ed.-M.Ed. — pitched at the graduation level.
- **Level 3:** M.Ed. — pitched at the graduation-plus-professional-education level.

The question paper is objective (MCQ-based), set in both English and Hindi, and is to be completed within two hours. Sections typically test language proficiency, reasoning/aptitude, and subject knowledge relevant to the chosen programme.

Campus Facilities

All RIEs are fully residential campuses and typically provide a library, hostels, a guest house, laboratories, sports facilities, a health centre, and a Demonstration Multipurpose School (DMS) that serves as a practice ground for trainee teachers. Most institutes also run a placement cell and offer merit scholarships covering a significant share of enrolled students.

Key Points for Applicants

- Choose an RIE based on your state/UT of domicile for undergraduate programmes, since regional eligibility applies.
- Postgraduate programmes (M.Ed., M.A. Education Technology) generally accept candidates nationwide, subject to seat availability.
- Check the seat matrix published for each institute and programme before applying, as intake varies by year.
- Selection depends on RIE CEE rank, category-wise reservation, and performance in the qualifying examination.
- Complete counselling formalities (document verification and fee payment) strictly within the announced deadlines to confirm a seat.
