Counselling Intelligence

The first two rounds of BITS counselling provide a clear indication of how admission trends are moving. However, the process is far from over. As candidates withdraw to join IITs and other top-tier institutes, scores begin to shift.

How Cutoffs Evolve

Movement varies annually based on:

- **Withdrawal Volume:** High-scoring candidates moving to IIT/NIT.
- **Waitlist Depth:** The concentration of students at specific score intervals.
- **Branch Stickiness:** Computer Science and MnC usually have the lowest withdrawal rates.

Expected Movement Trends

Based on current observations, here is the predicted movement for upcoming iterations:

HIGH PROBABILITY OF DROP

Civil, Manufacturing, Chemical, and M.Sc. Biological Sciences. These branches typically see the most vacancy creation.

MODERATE PROBABILITY

Mechanical, EEE, and ENI. Significant movement is possible if IIT Delhi/Bombay rounds conclude early.

LIMITED MOVEMENT

Computer Science and Mathematics & Computing. These seats are rarely vacated, leading to minimal score drops.

NOTE ON DUAL DEGREES

M.Sc. Economics and Math remain highly competitive, showing trends similar to senior engineering branches.

Campus-wise Outlook



Pilani Campus

The "Legacy Hub" remains the most stable. Movement here is generally the slowest across all campuses as it remains the primary choice for top-rankers.



Goa Campus

Healthy movement is expected in later rounds for circuit and core branches. Goa's coding culture keeps CS/MnC cutoffs very tight.

Historically experiences the most dynamic movement in mid-tier branches, providing the best "upgrade" opportunities for waitlisted candidates.

Counselling FAQs

Should I stay in the process if I am waitlisted?

Absolutely. Historically, many candidates receive seats in Iterations 4, 5, and 6 that they didn't expect in the first two rounds.

Will every branch move by the same score?

No. Core branches might see a 5-10 point drop, while CS might not move by even 1-2 points.

Can I get a better branch in later iterations?

Yes, upgrades are automatic based on your preference list if you have opted for internal sliding.

Final Takeaway

Patience is key in BITS counselling. The movement between Iteration 2 and Iteration 5 can be surprising. Stay informed, keep your documents ready, and monitor every update.
