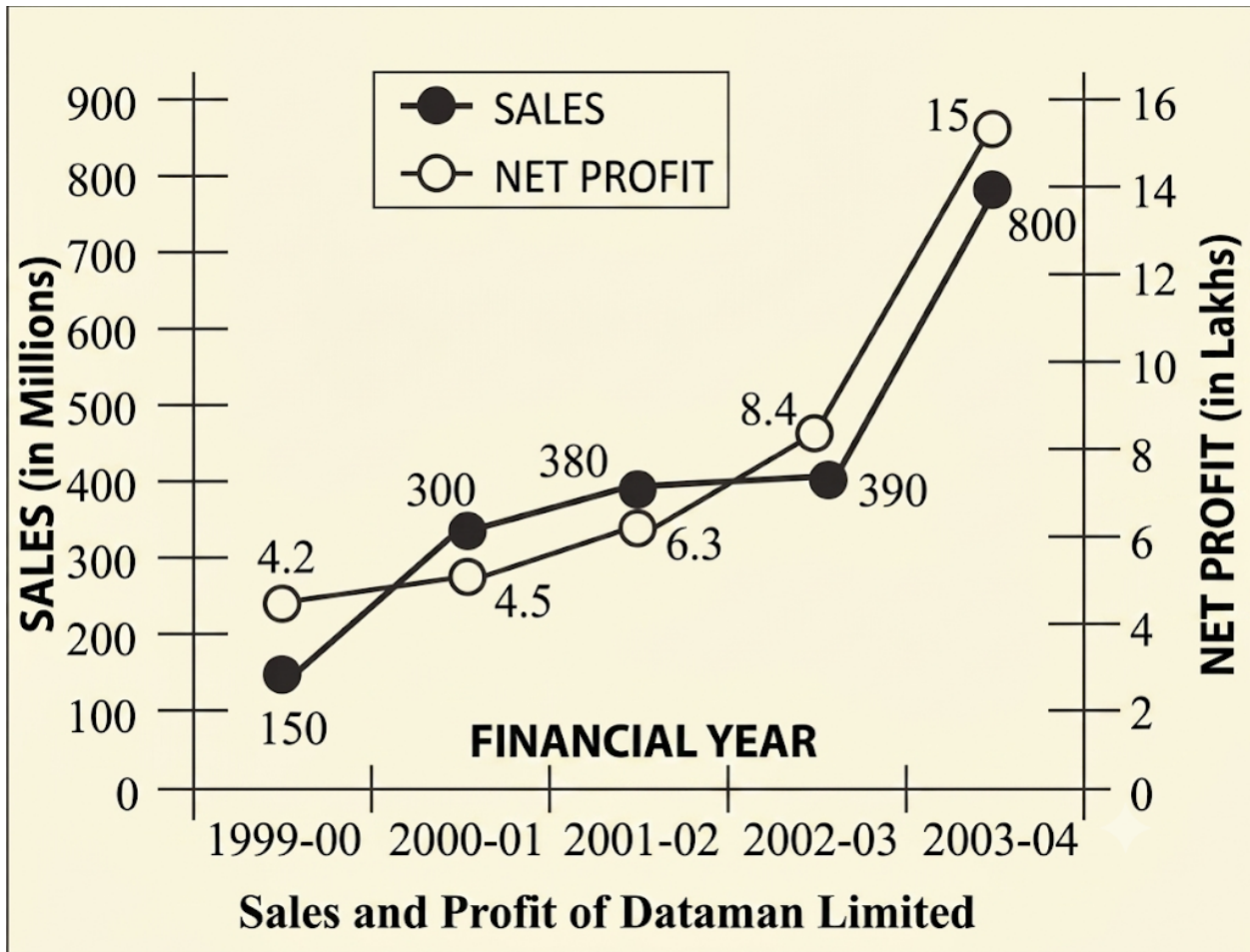

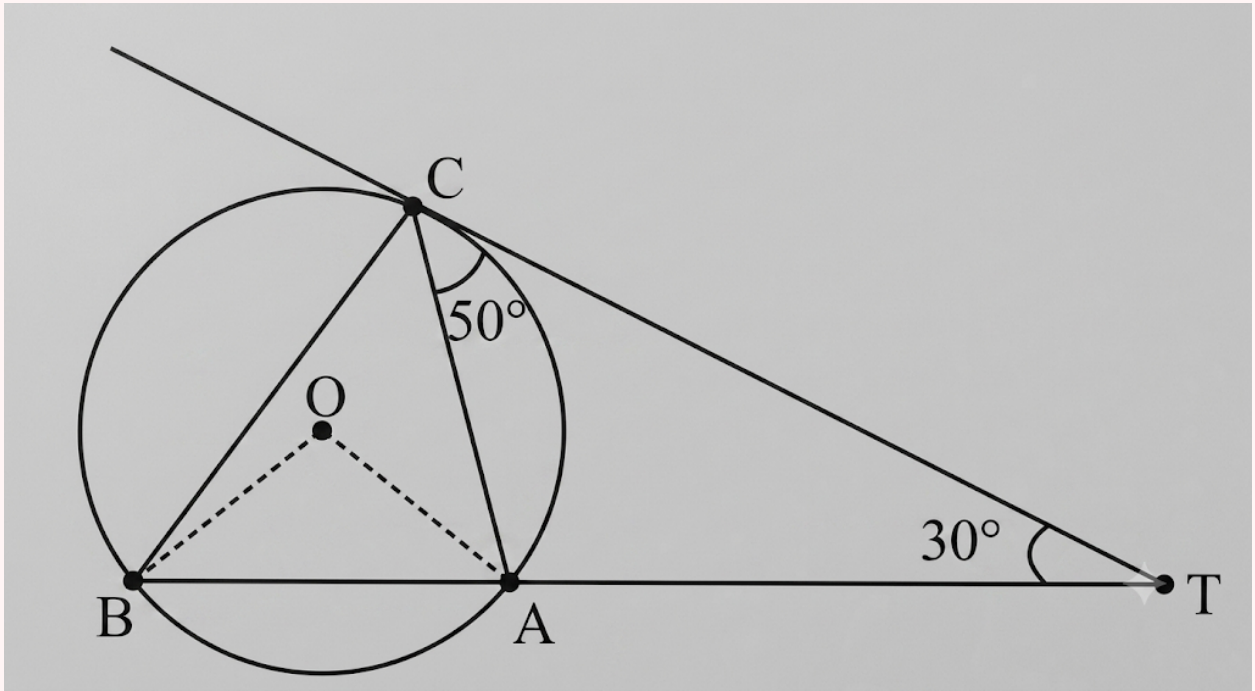

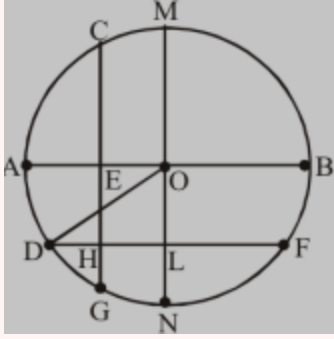

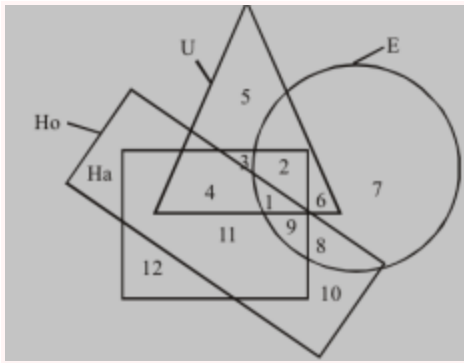

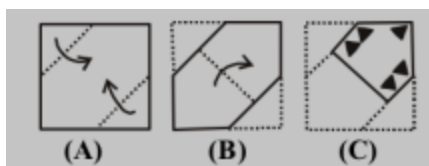

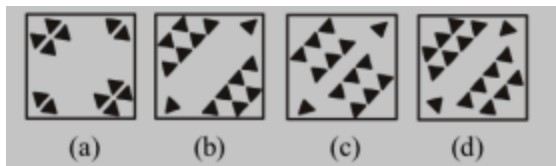

HINTS & SOLUTIONS

1. **(d)** The musician was testing the drum in (E) means drum is a percussion instrument (A). Drummed it into her in (F) means to force (D). The musicians were asked to drum in (G) means to beat a drum (B). Drumming her fingers in (H) means to sound rhythmically (C).

2. **(a)** In the passive voice, the focus shifts from the performer of the action (you) to the recipient of the action (others). We use the past participle of the verb (imitated) and add 'by' before the original subject (you).

3. **(b)** Reliable means something that can be trusted, inadequate means insufficient, novel is of a new kind and specious means false or misleading. According to the sentence the expert is able to trace the descent of fossil, so, it cannot seem reliable, what it would seem will be a word opposite to sufficient or reliable and that is inadequate.

4. **(a)** Acerbic means harsh in tone or manner, laconic is brief, remorseful is repenting having done something, stoical is suffering without complaint. Since the gap is followed by bitter and even, it should be a synonym of bitter in a higher degree which will be acerbic.

5. **(b)** The right use is *as + adjective + as*.

6. **(b)** The right usage is 'comes to mind'.

7. **(c)** Q contains the active subject and is thus the opening part. P will be the last as it

emphasises the 'blood pressure'.

8. (c) P is the opening sentence followed by R which gives another complaint, followed by S which gives yet another complaint. Q and T are examples of S.

9. (a) The use of 'that thing' is non-standard. Replace it with 'so'.

10. (b) The word 'perspicuous' means 'easy', 'clear' or lucid.

11. (c) Distraction is the antonym of Concentration.

12. (b) Remove 'to' after the word superior.

13. (a) The use of 'may' after the word whatever is redundant.

14. (c) Sprawl - to stretch; to spread. Other words are related to 'blame'; reprove.

16. (b) If x/y be a fraction, then: $2x / (y + 7) = 2/3 \Rightarrow 6x = 2y + 14 \Rightarrow 3x - y = 7$

$$(x + 2) / 2y = 3/5 \Rightarrow 5x + 10 = 6y \Rightarrow 5x - 6y = -10$$

Solving for x and y, we have $x = 4$ and $y = 5$. Thus the fraction is $4/5$.

17. (c) Mother's age when Ayesha's brother was born = 36 yrs.

Father's age when Ayesha's brother was born = $(38 + 4)$ years = 42 years.

Required difference = $(42 - 36)$ years = 6 years.

18. (b) $a^x = b$, $b^y = c$, and $c^z = a \Rightarrow (a^x)^{y^z} = a \Rightarrow a^{xyz} = a^1$. On comparing the powers of a, we get $xyz = 1$.

19. (c) Let the number of innings played in England be x.

Total runs scored in England = $46x$

Total runs scored for innings played in India = $55 \times 4 = 220$ (number of innings in India = 4)

Also, $(46x + 220) / (x + 4) = 48 \Rightarrow 46x + 220 = 48x + 192 \Rightarrow 2x = 28 \Rightarrow x = 14$.

20. (c) C.P. for B = 120% of Rs 400 = Rs 480. C.P. for C = 110% of Rs 480 = Rs 528.

21. (d) Let principal be Rs P and rate of interest be R% per annum.

Difference of C.I. and S.I. for 3 years = $(PR^2 / 10^4) \times ((300 + R) / 100)$

Difference of C.I. and S.I. for 2 years = $P(R / 100)^2$

Ratio = $(300 + R) / 100 = 25 / 8 \Rightarrow 8R = 100 \Rightarrow R = 12\frac{1}{2}\%$.

22. (b) Let speed of train be x km/h and speed of car be y km/h.

$$160/x + 600/y = 8$$

$$240/x + 520/y = 8 + 12/60 = 41/5$$

Multiplying and subtracting gives $y = 100$ km/h and $x = 80$ km/h. Speed of train = 80 km/h,
Speed of car = 100 km/h.

23. (b) Required Prob. = $\frac{7}{8} \times \frac{9}{10} = \frac{63}{80}$.

24. (a) $(M + 30) = 2(R - 30) \Rightarrow M - 2R = -90$ ---(i)

$(R + 10) = 3(M - 10) \Rightarrow R - 3M = -40$ ---(ii)

Solving (i) and (ii), we have $M = 34$ and $R = 62$.
